


OVERVIEW

In collaboration with Chiure District Administrative Government, Serviço Distrital de Planeamento e Infra-Estrutura (SDPI) and local authorities, IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix conducted movement intention surveys to **783** households hosting **3,136** individuals displaced from Chiure and Macomia districts in Cabo Delgado. Conflict and/or fear of attacks due to Non-State Armed Groups (NSAGs) in Cabo Delgado was the main trigger of displacement. At least 70% were displaced from Chiure Velho, 26% from Mazeze and 2% were from Ocuá posto. Other postos of origin includes Chiure sede, Katapula, Quiterajo and Mucojo.

An on-going household verification exercise confirmed the presence of **1,965** households hosting **8,600** individuals in Chiure Posto. Females constitutes 55% of the IDPs whilst 45% are males. Children make up 58% of those remaining displaced within the district.


DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE OF VERIFIED IDPS




SELF-REPORTED VULNERABILITIES OF VERIFIED IDPS

If you intend to return to your place of origin or go to another area, when do you intend to do so?






RELOCATION INTENTIONS
