

Event Overview

On 11, 12 and 15 April 2024, fires broke out in Kalari Abule camp in Konduga ward of Konduga Local Government Area (LGA), Malayi camp in Gaji Ganna I ward of Magumeri LGA, Government Girls' Secondary School camp in Mafa ward of Mafa LGA, Government Girls' Secondary School camp, Ngurno camp and Water Board camp in Monguno ward of Monguno LGA and International School camp in Ngala ward of Ngala LGA, all in Borno State. The fires damaged and destroyed shelters and belongings of numerous displaced households. There were reports of three fatalities and nine injuries. The fires impacted 1,185 emergency shelters, affecting 6,187 individuals in 1,176 households. The affected individuals included 3,373 children, 1,566 women and 1,248 men.

Of all the needs identified, shelter, food and non-food items (NFI) were the most prevalent. Other needs included water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), health and psychosocial support.

Following these events, DTM (Displacement Tracking Matrix) field staff conducted rapid assessments to inform the humanitarian community and Government/partners, and to enable a targeted response.




Fig. 2. Gender breakdown of affected population

Methodology: Crises and emergencies require the humanitarian community to act urgently. As a subcomponent of DTM's mobility tracking, flash reports utilise direct observation and a broad network of key informants to monitor sudden displacement resulting from events like natural disasters or attacks and collect information on the number, profile, and immediate needs of affected populations. In the initial 24 - 48 hours after an incident, DTM Nigeria activates a rapid assessment to document the event, urgent needs of affected individuals, demographic information, and impact. If displacement occurs, DTM Nigeria issues an Early Warning Flash/Incident report within 72 hours, notifying partners and stakeholders.
