




### METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

### LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 8 – 14 April.

### ALERT SUMMARY

Between 8 and 14 April 2024, a total of 462 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Adamawa and Borno states. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza, and Kala Balge Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State, and in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, and Michika LGAs of Adamawa State.


ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: improved security (178 individuals or 38%), poor living conditions (124 individuals or 27%), family re-unification (88 individuals or 19%), seasonal farming (45 individuals or 10%), military operations (14 individuals or 3%) and fear of attack (13 individuals or 3%).

There was no movement recorded on 10 April 2024, as a result of the holiday marking the end of the Ramadan fast.




### PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER




### NEEDS EVOLUTION\*

### MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY OF THE NEW ARRIVALS (CHILDREN 6 – 59 MONTHS)

Between 8 and 14 April 2024, an exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 49 children aged 6-59 months. Of the 49 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that four were recorded in the red category, four in the yellow category and 41 in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the two LGAs assessed.

All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted to the treatment programme.
