

Temporary Shelter Report #2 (14 August 2018)



Overview of the Report

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) deployed staff to support the Joint Rapid Assessment led by the Ministry of Health, focusing specifically on information regarding the camps / temporary shelters for those displaced by the flooding in Attapeu, Sanamxai District right after the flooding. Since then, IOM continued working together with the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare on data collection and information management on the displaced population.

The figures in this report does not represent the total number of displaced population nor the total needs, but an overview of findings based on initial observations, interviews with local leadership, affected persons, and the Government. This report contains analysis from a second round of raw data collected from the field, together with the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare and other partners. The purpose of the analysis is for assisting the planning interventions in Attapeu Province. IOM will continue supporting the Ministry of Social Welfare on additional data gathering.

Demographics of Displaced Population By Site (08/08/2018)




Figure 1: Number of internally displaced people in the Sanamxai District by site

Immediate Recommendations and Guidance Support



- Address vulnerabilities tracked including unaccompanied children, orphans, pregnant women etc.
- Urgent assessment needed for site #9 Donekhong to determine IDP population and priority needs
- Make a map of the site



- Begin decongestion and ensure that all families sleeping in the site are from the affected areas
- Provide tents or tarpaulins and support additional expansion areas to decongest as much as possible
- Ensure that the most vulnerable remain indoors
- Develop contact lists of service providers



Work with Shelter partner to provide recovery kits to allow people to return



- Provide minimum 1 latrine/toilet per 50 people, but 1 latrine/toilet per 20 people in the ideal scenario
- Separate women's and men's bathing and toilet facilities
- Provide a space for cooking
- Dig drainage to lower risks of dampness and disease



- Health and hygiene promotion
- Make a referral plan for the ill



- Register all distributions and their contents
- Ensure that children and elderly or other vulnerable receive distribution first



Request supplementary feeding for children, pregnant and lactating women



- Register incidents
- Create a referral plan for cases
