



### GENDER BREAKDOWN




### METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

### LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 15 – 21 April.

### TOP AREAS OF ORIGIN





### ALERT SUMMARY


Between 15 and 21 April 2024, a total of 1,529 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Adamawa, Borno and Yobe states. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Konduga and Monguno Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State, in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Song and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa State and in Geidam and Tarmuwa LGAs of Yobe State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: fear of attack (500 individuals or 33%), poor living conditions (409 individuals or 27%), family re-unification (238 individuals or 15%), improved security (163 individuals or 11%), seasonal farming (113 individuals or 7%) and military operations (106 individuals or 7%).


### PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER




### NEEDS EVOLUTION\*

### MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY OF THE NEW ARRIVALS (CHILDREN 6 – 59 MONTHS)

Between 15 and 21 April 2024, an exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 118 children aged 6-59 months. Of the 118 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 17 were recorded in the red category, 16 in the yellow category and 85 in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the five LGAs assessed.

Among the 118 children screened, 27 arrived from neighbouring countries (1 in Monguno and 26 in Mobbar); of all the 27 children measured; 25 were in green, one was in yellow and one was in the red category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted to the treatment programme.
