95% increase in displacement from the previous week (22 HHs)¹

IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements² in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks IDP returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

Between 23 and 29 June 2024, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 43 households (HHs) (258 individuals)³ who experienced displacement at least once.

Economic reasons related to the conflict were the main reason for displacement, accounting for 51 per cent (22 HHs) of the total followed by safety and security reasons as a result of the conflict, accounting for 47 per cent (20 HHs), and health reasons, accounting for two per cent (1 HH).

From 1 January to 29 June 2024, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 1,622 households (9,732 Individuals) who experienced displacement at least once.




