


New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners




Within the period of 17-23 December 2018, a total of 4,717 movements were recorded, including 4,272 arrivals and 445 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira Uba, Bama, Chibok, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Jere, Konduga, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guyuk, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo Belwa, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa state. Departures were recorded at Askira Uba LGA of Borno state and Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Yola North, and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa state.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (18%), improved security (5%), ongoing conflict (52%), poor living conditions (21%) and fear of attacks (4%).



Number of individuals by movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Monguno: 1,098 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno state. These include 676 arrivals from Bunari in Gowuram ward and 59 arrivals from Burwa in Mairari ward of Guzamala LGA, 298 arrivals from Hausari in Kukawa ward and 65 arrivals from Baga ward of Kukawa LGA of Borno State. The new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict.

Maiduguri: 898 arrivals were recorded in Maiduguri Metropolitan Council of Borno state. These include 185 arrivals from Pompom Gajaja, Pompom Akuya, Kangar and Lawanti in Baga ward and 176 arrivals from Kartari in Cross Kaiwa ward of Kukawa LGA, 505 arrivals from Mairari ward of Guzamala LGA, 24 arrivals from Maiboti in Galtimare Bale ward of Jere LGA and 8 arrivals from Gahgah in Sojiri Buduwa ward of Konduga LGA of Borno State. The new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict.

Gwoza: 661 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. These include 552 arrivals from Mora ward of Marwa in Cameroon, 4 arrivals from Wala/Warabe/Dure ward, 13 arrivals from Gava ward, 42 arrivals from Mbitya/Izge ward and 8 arrivals from Hambagda/Limankara/Jaje ward of Gwoza LGA, 3 arrivals from Baga ward of Kukawa LGA, 2 arrivals from Shehuri ward of Bama LGA, 12 arrivals from Wasa ward of AMAC in FCT Abuja and 25 arrivals from Daware ward of Fufore LGA in Adamawa State. 99% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions while 1% relocated voluntarily.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 280 children of 6-59 months. Of the 280 children screened, the MUAC reading was: 14 children (6 from inaccessible and 8 from accessible area) were in the Red category, 15 were in the Yellow category and 251 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that sent in reports.

The results also include 45 children from neighbouring LGAs (30 from Bama, 13 from Mobbar and 2 from Ngala): of all the 45 children measured, 3 was in red category, 38 in the green category and 4 in the yellow category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
