FLASH UPDATE #2 • FLOODS IN GHAT LIBYA

HIGHLIGHTS

Displacement

- Over 7,000 individuals have been displaced in the region of Ghat (southwestern Libya) after heavy rains caused flooding in the towns of Ghat and Tahala on 16 August 2024.
- Among those displaced, there are 4,346 Libyans who are sheltering in camps, informal temporary accommodation (e.g. tents near the flooded home), one school and with host families (map 2).
- Also among those displaced there are 2,745 migrants from Niger (1,325 ind), Mali (573 ind), Egypt (451 ind), Nigeria (126 ind), Sudan (125 ind), Burkina Faso (80 ind) and Ghana (65 ind) who are being accommodated by relatives and friends in neighbourhoods that have not been affected by the floods.

Damage

According to field reports, the main road linking the towns of **Albarkat** and **Issein is** cut off and there continues to be a power outage in the area.





