




METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect. information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria. ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 18 – 25 August

ALERT SUMMARY


Between 18 and 25 August 2024, a total of 2,238 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Benue State. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Agatu, Katsina-Ala and Ukum local government areas (LGAs) of Benue State.

ETT assessments identified conflict/attack as the main trigger for these movements in the state.


The majority of the arrivals were from Agatu LGA, with 2,200 individuals, which accounted for 98 per cent of the arrivals. This was followed by arrivals from Katsina-Ala LGA with 22 individuals, which accounted for one per cent of the arrivals. A total of 16 individuals arrived from Ukum LGA, these arrivals accounted for one per cent of the arrivals for the week.







NEEDS EVOLUTION*
