





## **METHODOLOGY**

The purpose of the emergency tracking tool is to collect information on sudden and significant displacements mainly triggered by security and climatic emergencies. The information is collected through key informant interviews and direct observations.

This dashboard presents a summary of information on confirmed movements of people during the period from August 1 to 31, 2024 in the Lake province.

#### **SUMMARY OF THE ALERT**

Since the beginning of 2024, several security incidents have occurred in the Lake province, resulting in a large number of displacements. During August, 450 households (1,735 individuals) were affected by displacement. All of these people were members of local communities prior to their displacement. Thus, the main reason for their displacement was due to armed attacks (100%).

All the displaced persons were displaced from the same subprefecture (Kaiga-Kindjiria) and found refuge within the same sub-prefecture (Kaiga-Kindjiria).

As for the first priority needs, 100 percent of localities expressed the need for food. Shelter (50%) and drinking water (50%) had same percentage for second and third priority needs.
