

MAP OF LOCALITIES AFFECTED BY EVENTS






METHODOLOGY

The purpose of the emergency tracking tool is to collect information on sudden and significant displacements mainly triggered by security and natural disasters. The information is collected through key informant interviews and direct observations

This dashboard presents an overview of confirmed population movements from July 1 to July 29, 2024 in the Lake province.

SUMMARY OF THE ALERT

Since the start of 2024, several security incidents have occurred in the Lake province, resulting in significant population displacements. In July, 704 households (3,269 individuals) were affected by displacement. The majority of these people (63%) were members of the host communities prior to their displacement. The main trigger of displacement for the affected population are armed attacks (66%) and kidnappings (34%).

While the sub-prefecture of origin for 62 per cent of the displaced population is Daboua, the same percentage found refuge in the displacement locations in Daboua sub-prefecture (see page 2).

For the first priority need, the majority of persons in 100 per cent of the localities preferred food. For the second priority need, the majority of persons in the localities preferred drinking water (57%), shelter (29%) and cash (14%).
