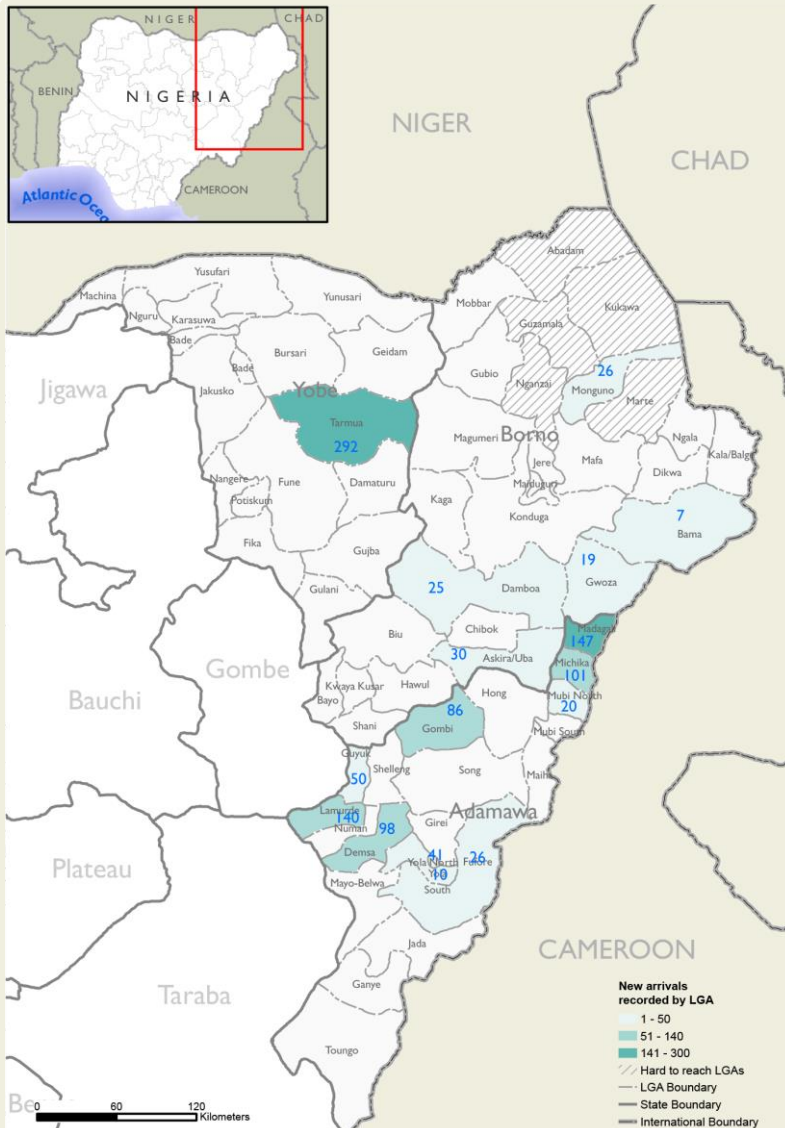

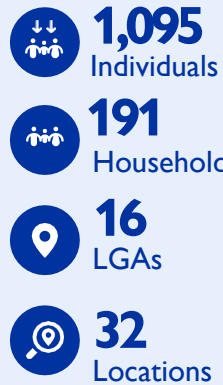

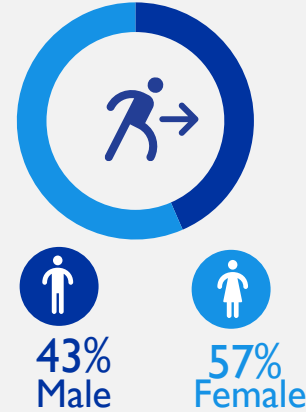

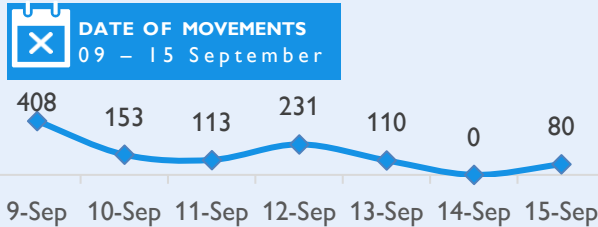
METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 09 – 15 September 2024.

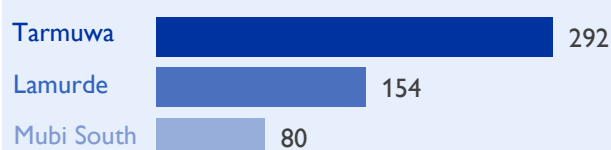
DISPLACEMENT EVOLUTION

ALERT SUMMARY

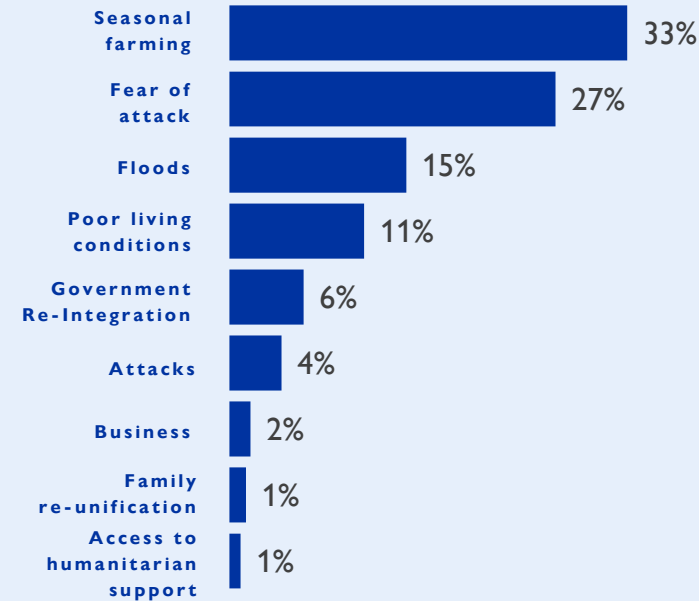
Between 09 and 15 September 2024, a total of 1,095 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Adamawa, Borno and Yobe states. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Gwoza and Monguno local government areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State, in Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Guyuk, Lamurde, Madagali, Michika, Mubi North, Yola North and Yola South LGA of Adamawa State, and in Tarmua LGA of Yobe State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: seasonal farming (360 individuals or 33%), fear of attack (295 individuals or 27%), flood (160 individuals or 15%), poor living conditions (122 individuals or 11%), government re-integration (67 individuals or 6%), attacks (47 individuals or 4%), business (19 individuals or 2%), family re-unification (15 individuals or 1%) and access to humanitarian support (10 individuals or 1%).

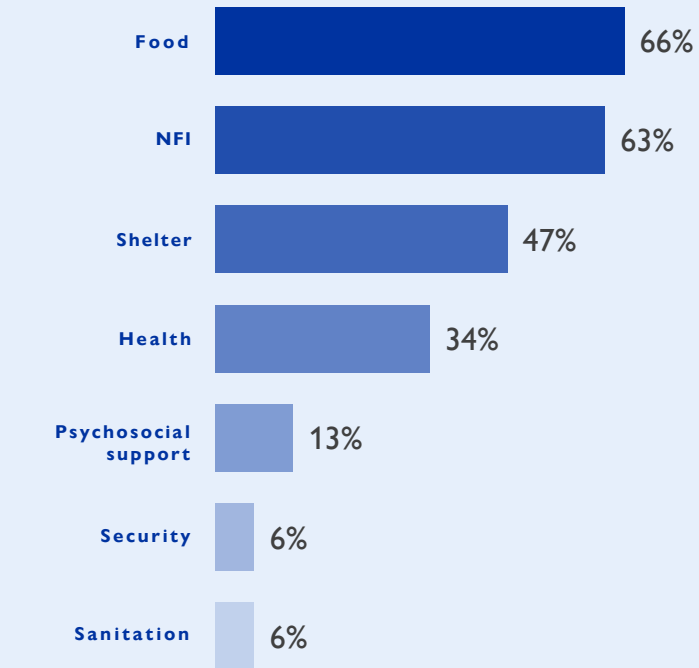

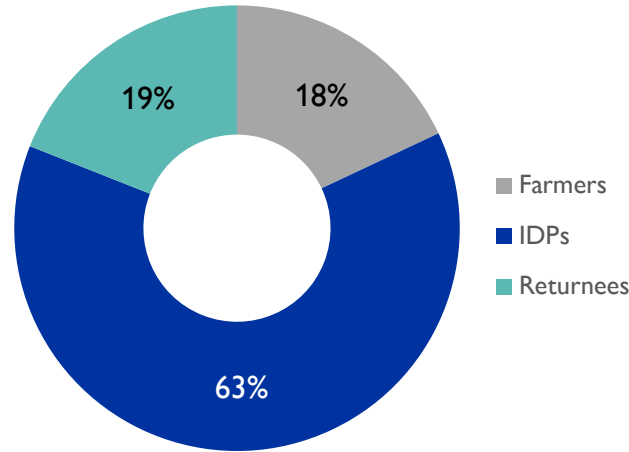
PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER



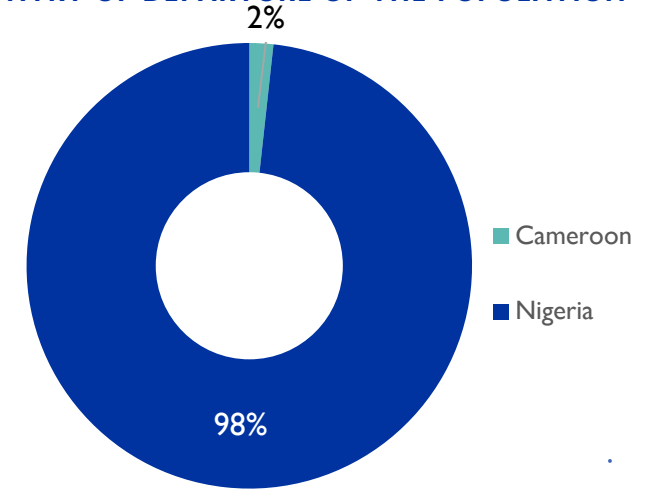

MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY OF THE NEW ARRIVALS (CHILDREN 6 – 59 MONTHS)

Between 09 and 15 September 2024, an exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 195 children aged 6-59 months. Of the 195 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 5 were recorded in the red category, 18 in the yellow category and 172 in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the five LGAs assessed.

Among the 195 children screened, 149 arrived from neighbouring countries (148 in Mobbar LGA and 1 in Kala Balge LGA); of all the 149 children measured; 139 were in green, 10 were in yellow and none in red category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted to the treatment programme.
