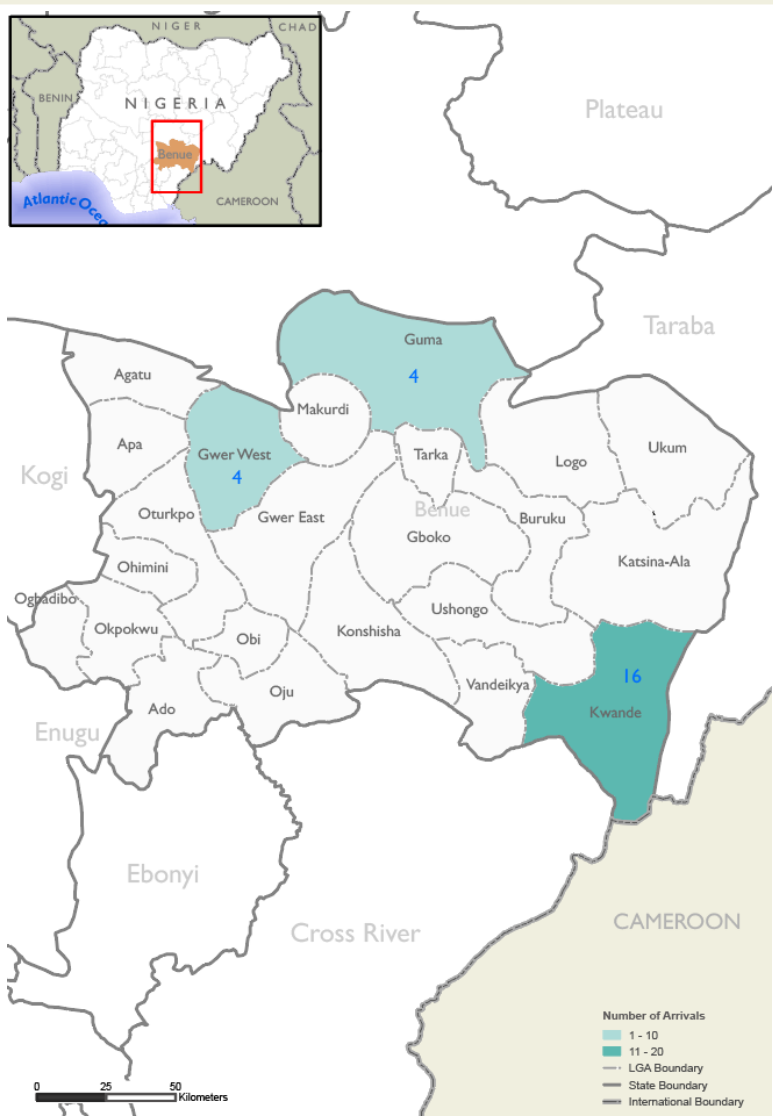

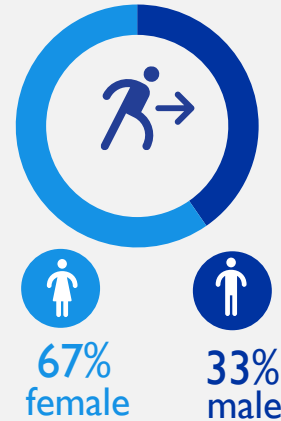

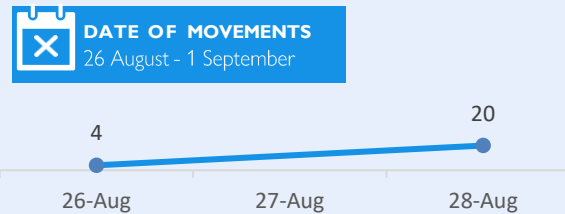
METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 26 August – 1 September

ALERT SUMMARY

Between 26 August and 1 September 2024, a total of 24 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Benue State. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Guma, Gwer-West and Kwande local government areas (LGAs) of Benue State.

ETT assessments identified conflict/attack as the main trigger for these movements in the state.

The majority of the arrivals were from Kwande LGA, with 16 individuals, which accounted for 66 per cent of the arrivals. This was followed by arrivals from Guma LGA with 4 individuals, which accounted for 17 per cent of the arrivals. A total of 4 individuals arrived from Gwer-West LGA, these arrivals accounted for 17 per cent of the arrivals for the week.

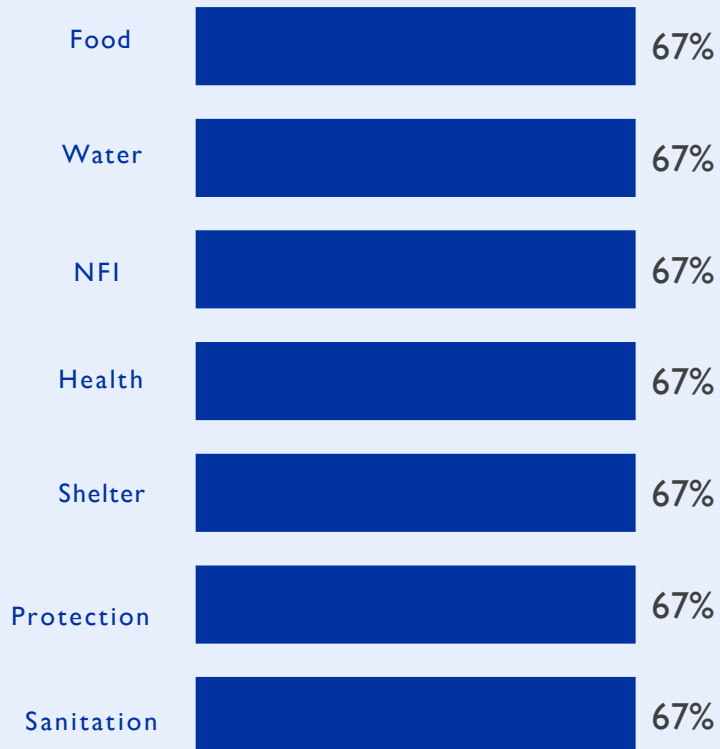

PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER

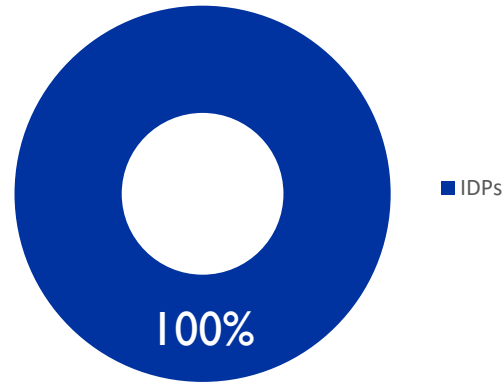

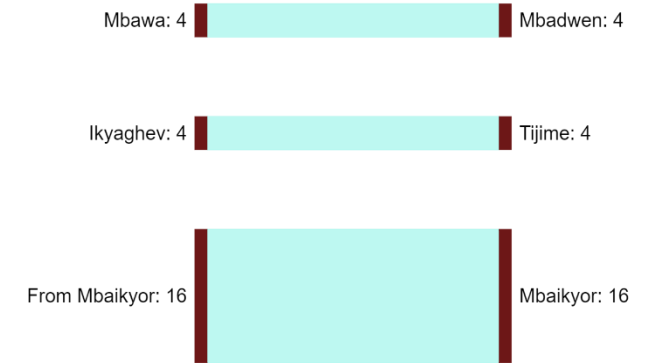

The sankey diagram above shows movement flows by ward of the affected LGAs. Four individuals arrived from Mbawa to Mbadwen ward, four from Ikyaghev to Tijime ward, and 16 from Mbaikyor to Mbaikyor ward at different locations.
