





METHODOLOGY

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a sub-component of the mobility tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilizes direct observations and a broad network of key informants to capture the best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.

LIMITATIONS

The ETT figures reported are not cumulative of all the affected persons thus far but rather provide a snapshot of the current displacement situation on the date indicated. The data and information reported on this dashboard are related solely to the movements caused by the triggers on page two between 02-08 September

ALERT SUMMARY

Between 02 and 08 September 2024, a total of 687 new arrivals were recorded at locations in Benue State. The new arrivals were recorded at locations in Logo and Ukum local government areas (LGAs) of Benue State.


ETT assessments identified conflict/attack as the main trigger for these movements in the state.

The majority of the arrivals were from Ukum LGA, with 679 individuals, which accounted for 99 per cent of the arrivals. A total of eight individuals arrived from Logo LGA, these arrivals accounted for one per cent of the arrivals for the week.






