




New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners Children (6-59 months) screened for malnutrition MUAC category of screened children Green: 290 Yellow: 15

Within the period of 4 - 10 March 2019, a total of 2,102 movements were recorded, including 1,731 arrivals and 371 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Damboa, Gwoza, Jere, Kaga, Konduga, Mobbar and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Maiha and Numan LGAs of Adamawa state. Departures were recorded at Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state and Fufore, Maiha and Numan LGAs of Adamawa state.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (11%), improved security (18%), ongoing conflict (19%) and poor living conditions (52%)

Summary of major movements

Gwoza: 748 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. These include 733 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon, 6 arrivals from Shashaw ward in Hong LGA of Adamawa state, 8 arrivals from Hambagda/Limankara ward of Gwoza LGA tracked at GSS camp in Bulabulin/Wakane ward of Gwoza LGA and 1 arrival from Sambisa in Dure ward of Gwoza LGA tracked at Transit camp in Pulka/Bokko ward of Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions.

Jere: 309 arrivals were recorded in Jere LGA of Borno state. The new arrivals were all from Gajigana ward of Magumeri LGA of Borno state and they all reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict.

Askira/Uba: 35 arrivals and 248 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. These include 20 arrivals from Uba Marghi in Uba ward of Askira/Uba LGA tracked at Multhfu in Kopa/Multhafu ward of Askira Uba LGA of Borno state, 15 arrivals from Kona ward in Jalingo LGA of Taraba state, 159 departures from Damboa central ward of Damaboa LGA, 3 departures from Gatamarwa ward in Chibok LGA of Borno State and 86 departures from K/Wurogayandi ward of Madagali LGA of Adamawa state. 57% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to improved security and 43% voluntarily relocated while the departure was due to improved security.

Bama: 270 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. These include 142 arrivals from Darajamal ward, 20 arrivals from Boduwa ward and 14 arrivals from Soye ward of Bama LGA and were tracked at GSSSS camp in Shehuri ward of Bama LGA, 25 arrivals from Galtimari ward of Jere LGA and 69 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon. 63% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions while 37% relocated voluntarily.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 309 children of 6-59 months. Of the 309 children screened, the MUAC reading was: 4 children (2 apiece from Inaccessible and accessible area) were in the Red category, 15 were in the Yellow category and 290 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that sent in reports.

The results also include 13 children from a neighbouring Cameroon and Nigeri who all moved to Bama. Out of the 13 children measured, 2 were in the red category, 11 were in the green category and no child was in the yellow category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition
