




# EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)

### Movements




### New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners




Within the period of 25 - 31 March 2019, a total of 7,162 movements were recorded, including 6,628 arrivals and 534 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Chibok, Dikwa, Gwoza, Konduga, Maiduguri and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state and locations in Demsa, Maiha and Numan LGAs of Adamawa state. Departures were recorded at Askira/Uba and Chibok LGAs of Borno state, Fufore and Numan LGAs of Adamawa state.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (4%), improved security (1%), ongoing conflict (77%), fear of attack (2%), military operation (1%) and poor living conditions (15%)



### Number of individuals by movement triggers

### Summary of major movements

**Askira/Uba:** 3,716 arrivals and 311 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. These include 865 arrivals from Gatamarwa ward of Chibok LGA, 2851 from Kopa/Multhfu ward of Askira Uba LGA tracked at Uba and Lassa wards of the LGA. Also, there were 9 departures from Maisandari ward of Maiduguri Metropolitan Council (MMC) of Borno state, 89 departures from Lamurde ward of Mubi South LGA, 70 departures from Damare ward of Girei LGA, 69 departures from Sorau A ward of Maiha LGA, 28 departures from Kwarhi ward of Hong LGA and 17 departures from Jambutu ward of Yola north LGA of Adamawa state. The new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict. 75% of the departures were due to poor living conditions, 22% due to the ongoing conflict while 9% was due to fear of attack.

**Chibok:** 739 departures were recorded in Chibok LGA of Borno state. All the departures were from Gatamarwa ward of Chibok LGA heading for Anguwa Gabar in Askira East ward of Askira/Uba LGA. The departure was due to the ongoing conflict.

**Konduga:** 707 arrivals were recorded in Konduga LGA of Borno state. All the arrivals were from Mile 3 in Baga ward of Kukawa LGA of Borno State. The new arrivals reported to have relocated due to ongoing conflict.

**Gwoza:** 638 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. These include 13 arrivals from Ngoshe ward of Gwoza LGA tracked at Pulka/Bokko ward of the LGA, 49 arrivals from Buliya ward of Bama LGA of Borno state, 6 arrivals from Lagos Island of Lagos state, 17 arrivals from Wuro Ade ward of Maiha LGA, 12 arrivals from Gulak ward of Madagali LGA, 11 arrivals from Lamurde ward of Mubi South LGA of Adamawa state and 530 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon. 94% of the new arrivals relocated due to poor living conditions while 4% relocated voluntarily.

**Bama:** 281 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. These include 61 arrivals from Darajamal ward, 31 arrivals from Banki ward and 16 arrivals from Soye ward of Bama LGA all tracked at GSSSS camp in Shehuri ward of Bama LGA. A further 173 individuals arrived from Marwa in Cameroon. 28% of the new arrivals were reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions, 22% due to military operations, while 50% voluntarily relocated.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

## New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 333 children of 6-59 months. Of the 333 children screened, the MUAC reading was: 8 children (4 apiece from accessible and inaccessible area ) were in the Red category, 22 were in the Yellow category and 303 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 3 LGAs that sent in reports.

The results also include 190 children from neighbouring Cameroon (58 moved to Bama, 130 to Gwoza and 2 to Ngala). Out of the 190 children measured, 3 children were in the red category, 171 were in the green category and 16 children were in the yellow category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. The data presented is not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
