

Aweil North & East, Northern Bahr el Ghazal

Data collected on 7-18 March 2019

Majokyinthiou, Jaac and Kiir Adem are some of the main points of entry between Sudan and South Sudan in Northern Bahr El Ghazal. These areas, as well as Ariath, have been receiving an influx of South Sudanese persons moving from Sudan without being able to continue onwards to their habitual residences further south, finding themselves in continued internal) displacement. Reasons for staying in the areas instead of moving onwards to former homes or third locations are threefold: most crucially, there has been a lack of transport options making further travel difficult. Some IDPs staying in Kiir Adem cited the availability of milk provided by cattle keepers as reason for staying and are expected to accompany these when the rainy season starts. IDPs are further making use of the available livelihoods, tapping trees to collect gum arabic, a primary resource which can be to gum traders. IDPs in Rumaker are displaced within their own villages after a wild fire burnt down shelters in February 2019.
