


Flow Monitoring Points | Migrant Arrivals and Yemeni Returns from Saudi Arabia in Feb 2019


Displacement Tracking in Yemen includes the monitoring of key migrant and return locations on Yemen's northern border with Saudi Arabia and southern coastal border. Enumerators placed at Flow Monitoring Points (FMPs) monitor the arrivals and departures of migrants and Yemeni nationals in order to identify different patterns and types of migration, including quantitative estimates to help define the population of irregular migrants present in the country. Access constraints limit the ability to collect data at some migrant departure and arrival points. IOM estimates that 8,488 migrants entered Yemen in addition to 4,682 Yemeni returns from Saudi Arabia during February 2019.





Migrant Arrivals by Nationality




Total Migrants per Month, by Nationality




Migrants by Country of Intended Destination




Migrants per Nationality and FMP


