IOM Nigeria DTM carried out rapid assessments in Madali and Shelleng LGAs of Adamawa State following recent Boko Haram attacks in Madagali and flooding in Shelleng.

MADAGALI LGA

An assessment was carried out on 17 August 2017 by the DTM team in response to the displacement of persons into Madagali LGA. The assessment team confirmed that 3 villages (Bakin-Dutse, Humbili and Wuno) were recently affected by Boko Haram attacks. Two of the villages, Bakin-Dutse and Humbili were attacked on 8 and 9 August respectively, while the people of Wuno fled, fearing a possible attack on their village. A total of 216 households and 1,511 individuals were displaced from the villages. The displaced persons are currently staying at Lomure Gulak and gare Gulak.

Recommendation

A number of the displaced persons have been accommodated by members of the host community, but a large number are still staying in the open with no shelter. Shelter, NFI and food are priority needs for them at the moment.

SHELLENG LGA

As a direct response to rainstorm which occurred on 17 of August in Shelleng LGA, DTM carried out a rapid assessment in Shelleng to assess the level of damage sustained in the community as a result of the flooding.

3 sites were assessed, Anguwan Garba, Anguwan Tashan Bode and Tashan Kaya Bebbe.
