

The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to quickly collect information on sudden displacements of populations. Information is collected through key informant interviews and direct observation. This dashboard provides information on events which occurred at Faya, from 30 May to 02 June 2019. Data was collected on 02 June 2019.

SUMMARY OF THE EVENT

Between 30 May and 2 June 2019, 120 individuals arrived in Faya in the province of Borkou from the Tibesti province: 64 persons from Zouarké, 47 persons from Wour and 9 persons from Sondenga. It was reported that they had originally planned to travel to gold mines in Northern Chad and that they were intercepted by authorities and brought to Faya.

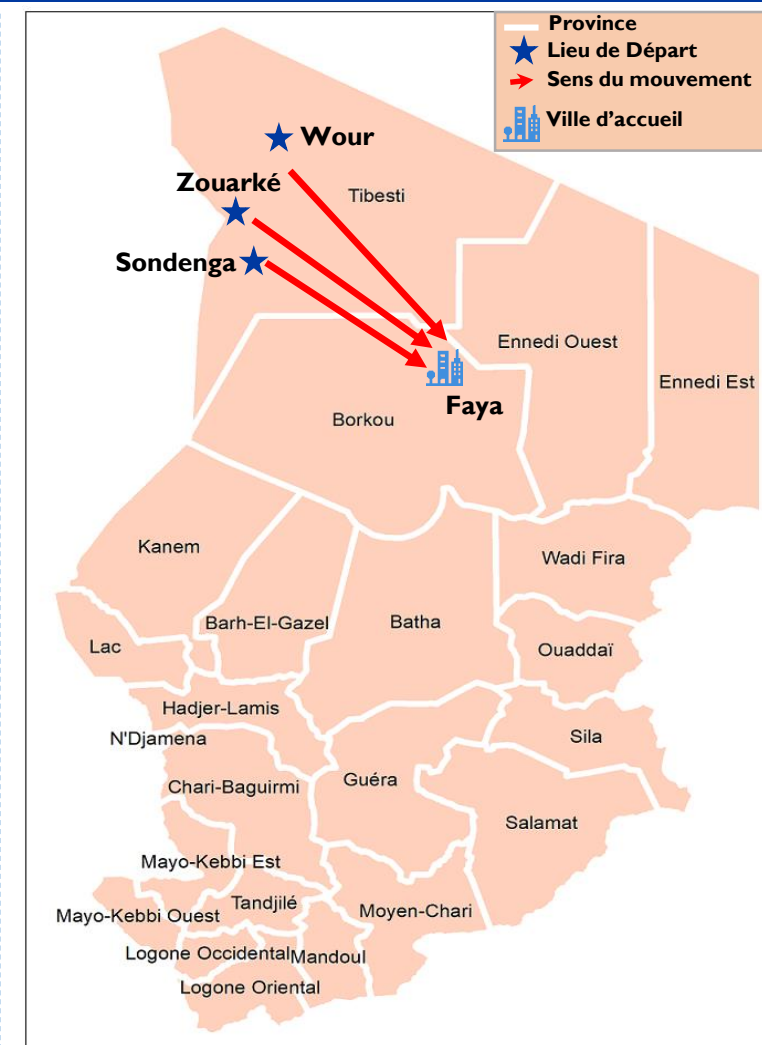
