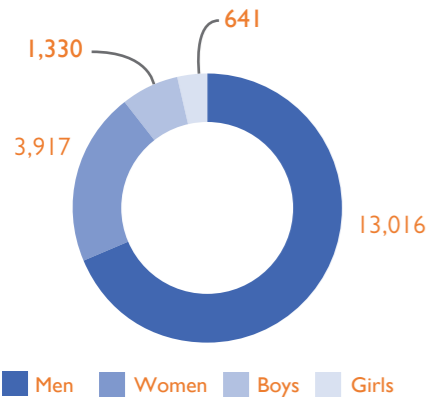


# Flow Monitoring Points | Migrant Arrivals and Yemeni Returns from Saudi Arabia in May 2019

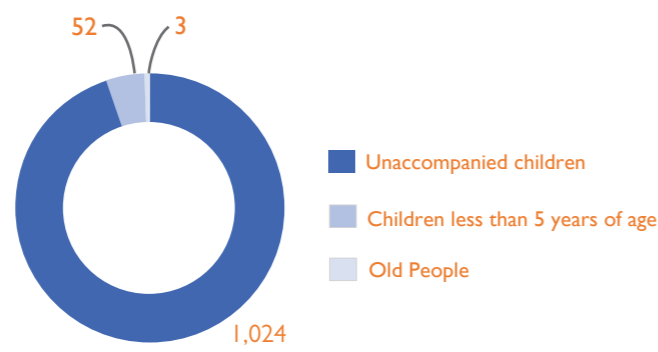
Displacement Tracking in Yemen includes the monitoring of key migrant and return locations on Yemen's northern border with Saudi Arabia and southern coastal border. Enumerators placed at Flow Monitoring Points (FMPs) monitor the arrivals of migrants and Yemeni nationals in order to identify different patterns and types of migration, including quantitative estimates to help define the population of irregular migrants present in the country. Access constraints limit the ability to collect data at some migrant arrival points. IOM estimates that 18,904 migrants entered Yemen in addition to 5,229 Yemeni returns from Saudi Arabia during May 2019 bringing the number of migrants who have arrived in Yemen in 2019 to 74,333 and the number of Yemeni returnees to 24,795.

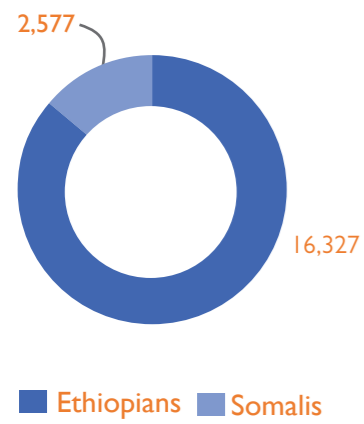

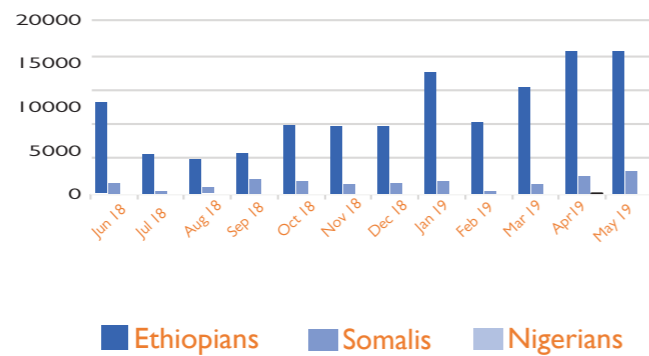

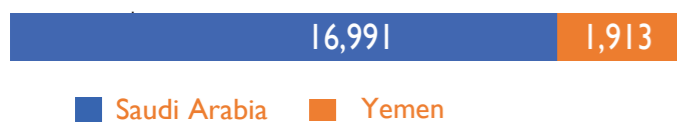
### Migrant Arrivals by Nationality



### Total Migrants per Month, by Nationality



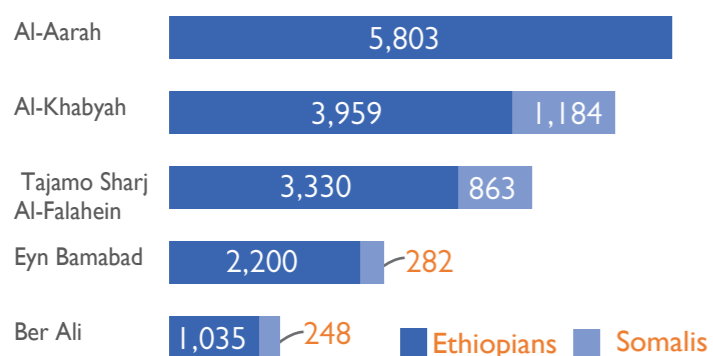
### Migrants by Country of Intended Destination



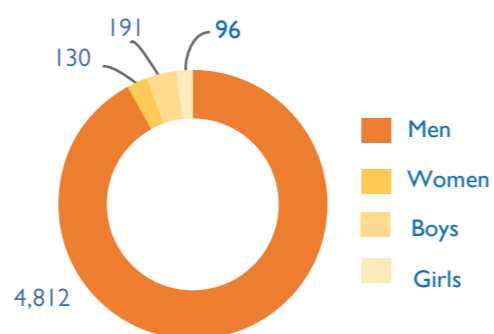
### Migrants by Country of Departure



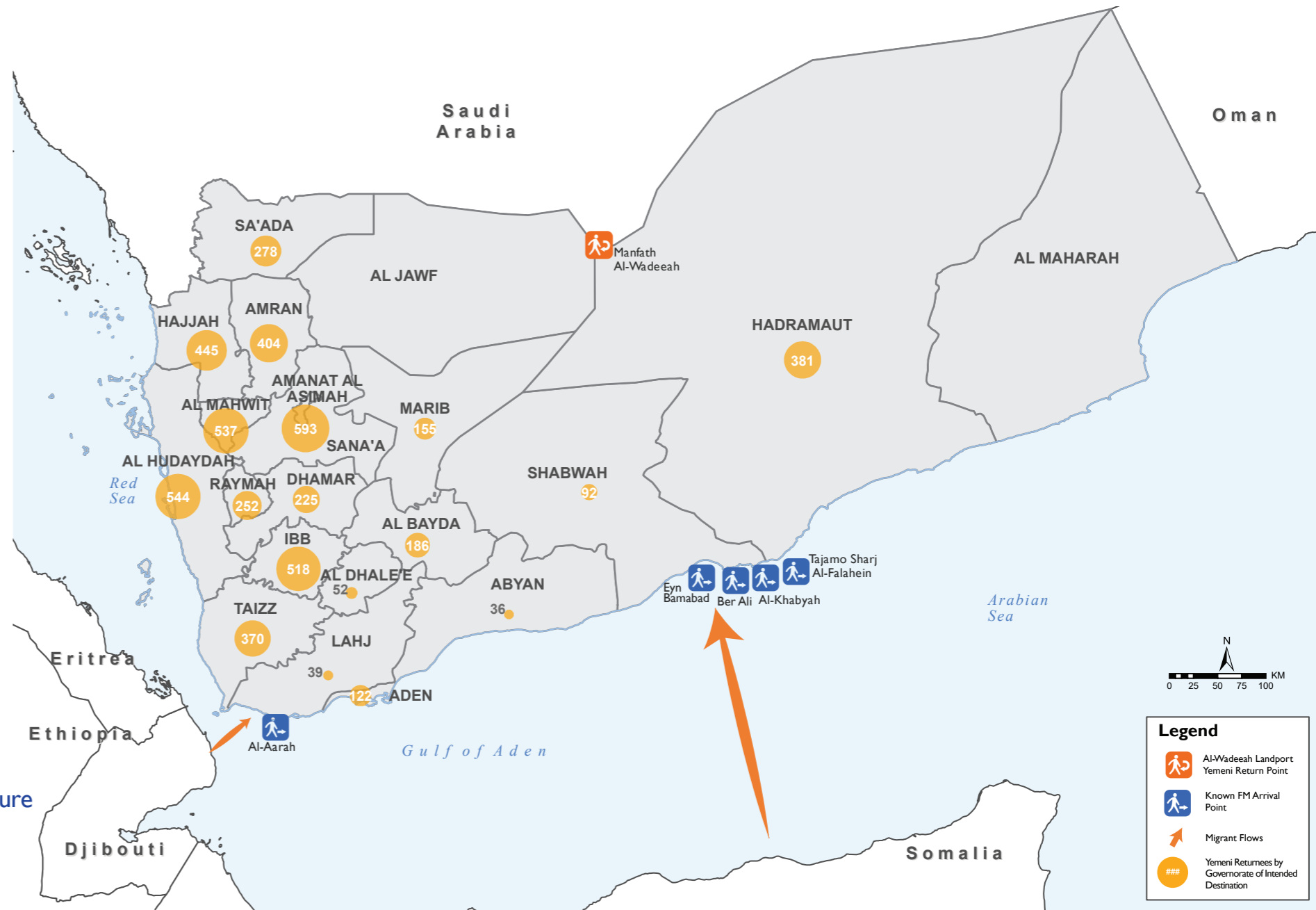
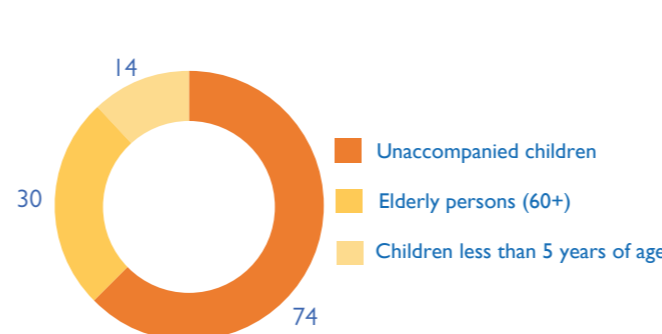

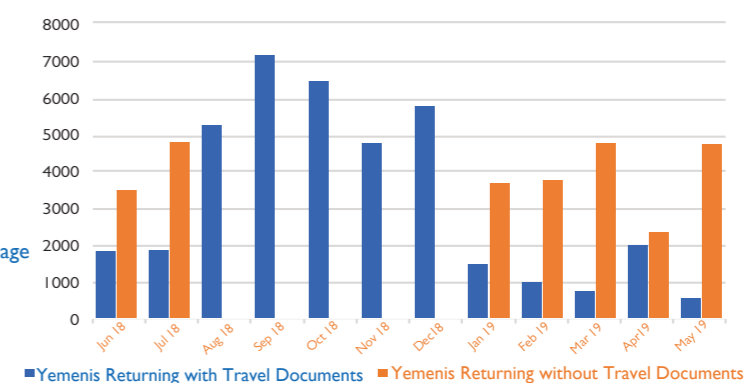
