


Harrowing Journeys - Children and youth on the move across the Mediterranean

There were 186,768 new arrivals to Europe between January and December 2017a 52% decrease compared to 387,739 reported in 2016. Main origin countries of migrants and asylum seekers who arrived to Italy, Greece and Spain (98% of all arrivals) were Nigeria, Guinea, Syria, Iraq, Morocco

and Algeria. At the end of December 2017, more than 60,000 migrants and asylum seekers accommodated in Greece, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia, Hungary, Bulgaria, Cyprus and Romania (see Overview 2017). DTM data shows an increase in irregular

entries to Bosnia and Herzegovina (143 vs. 755) and Montenegro (308 vs. 807) between 2016 and 2017. In contrast to that, apprehensions in Kosovo (UNSCR 1244) decreased from 279 in 2016 to 146 in 2017, and in Albania from 831 to 752 respectively.
