Displacement Profile: West New Britain Province

This infographic presents findings from sites hosting Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in West New Britain Province after the eruption of Ulawun Volcano on 26 June 2019. Presented are findings from six (6) IDP sites namely **Soi, Bakada*, Gigipuna-VJ Camp, Sabali Beach, Kabaya* and Koasa.** It is reported that there are IDPs at Barema which is located in the Hargy Palm Oil Company's plantation.¹




PERCENT IDPs BY SITE






Frequency of food distribution



Most reported sources of food for majority of IDPs: Gardens from villages of origin, food aid and assistance from relatives.
