



### Ashshgega



An estimated 125 migrants were reported to have arrived in Ashshgega from the south and are reportedly planning to continue their journey to other destinations.

### Ashshwayrif



An estimated 140 migrants reportedly arrived in Ashshwayrif from Southern Libya and are planning to continue their journey to other destinations according to field observers.

### Benghazi



An estimated 700 migrants reportedly arrived in Benghazi looking for work opportunities, mostly in the construction sector.

### Derna



As the security situation remained stable, people continued to return. In June, at least 45 individuals were reported to have returned to Derna, and their reported needs included food, NFIs, medicines, and protection.

### Emsaed



An estimated 80 to 110 migrants were reported to have arrived in Emsaed from Egypt, reportedly for economic reasons.

### Ghat



Heavy rain and floods forced over 5,075 individuals, including 450 migrants, to leave their homes in Ghat to surrounding areas, including Sebha and Ubari. Most IDPs were reported to be staying with relatives and host families while around one third of the displaced population (1,850 IDPs) were hosted in collective shelters. Reported needs included medical care, food and NFIs.

**Harawa**

An estimated 180 to 270 migrants were also reported to have arrived from Alkufra, Ejdabia and Sebha; some of the migrants were reportedly looking for job opportunities while others are planning to continue their journey onwards to other destinations.

**Janoub Azzawya**

An estimated 60 migrants were reportedly arrived in Janoub Azzawya from nearby municipalities..

**Janzour**

An estimated 85 migrants were reported to have arrived in Janzour from unstable neighbouring municipalities and were reportedly looking for job opportunities.

**Qasr Akhyar**

An estimated 500 migrants were reported to have arrived to Qasr Akhyar from municipalities in proximity of the conflict in South Tripoli; some were reportedly looking for work while others were planning to continue their journey to other destinations.

**Sebha**

An estimated 125 individuals were reported to have been displaced to Sebha from Ghat due to heavy rain and floods in May; reported priority needs included food and NFIs.

**Sirt**

An estimated 350 to 550 migrants were reported to have arrived to Sirt from Aljufra, Ejdabia and Bani Waleed; some of the migrants were reportedly planning to continue their journey to other destinations.

**Suq Aljumaa**

Approximately 450 migrants were reported to have arrived to Suq Aljumaa from nearby unstable municipalities in June.

**Tazirbu**

Approximately 410 migrants were reported to have arrived to Tazirbu, and were reported to be planning to continue their journey to other destinations.

**Ubari**

An estimated 625 individuals were reportedly displaced to Ubari from Ghat due to heavy rain and floods in May; reported needs included food, NFIs, and medical care. It was reported that some of the IDPs were renting while others were staying with relatives.

**Zliten**

Approximately 500 migrants were reported to have arrived to Zliten from south Tripoli, and were reported to be looking for work.

**Tripoli**

Since 4 April 2019, the onset of hostilities in Tripoli has resulted in displacement of a large number of families from their homes in search of safety and protection.

On 5 April, DTM initiated Emergency Tracking of the displaced households throughout the conflict affected areas of southern Tripoli, and as of 27 June 2019, a total of 20,975 families (approximately 104,875 individuals) have been identified as internally displaced persons (IDPs).
