





Within the period of 29 July - 4 August, a total of 1,390 movements were recorded, including 1,011 arrivals and 379 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Jere, Kaga, Kala/Balge, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state and locations in Demsa, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa state. Departures were recorded in Bama and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno state and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mubi South, Numan, song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa state.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (31%), improved security (18%), flood (4%), ongoing conflict (7%) and poor living conditions (41%).







## **Summary of major movements**

Ngala: 207 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno state. These include 60 arrivals from Rann ward of Kala Balge LGA, 19 arrivals from Darak, 63 from Fotokol and 18 from Makary in Cameroon, 47 arrivals from Bol in Chad. The new arrivals all relocated due to poor living conditions.

Bama: 144 arrivals and 7 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. These include 29 from Darajamal ward and 12 from Buduwa ward of Bama LGA and were tracked at Shehuri/Hausari/Mairi ward of Bama LGA. Other arrivals include 20 from Konduga ward of Konduga LGA and 51 from Mora in Cameroon. The 7 departures were all from Konduga ward of Konduga LGA. 40% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions and 60% relocated voluntarily. The departures were all voluntary.

Askira/Uba: 100 arrivals were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. These include 13 arrivals from Uba ward and 19 arrivals from Zadawa ward of Askira/Uba LGA and were tracked at Mussa and Ngohi wards of Askira Uba LGA. Other arrivals include 61 from Miringa ward of Biu LGA and 7 from Girei LGA of Adamawa state. 19% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions and 81% due to improved security.

Kaga: 91 arrivals were recorded in Kaga LGA of Borno state. These include 56 arrivals from Auno/Chabbol and 35 from Jakana ward of Konduga LGA. The new arrivals all relocated due to the ongoing conflict.

### New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 116 children of 6-59 months. Of the 116 children screened, the MUAC reading was 8 children (accessible areas) in the Red category, 15 were in the Yellow category and 93 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 5 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 56 children from neighbouring countries (20 children in Bama, 7 in Mobbar, and 29 in Ngala); of all the 56 children measured, 4 were in the red category with 43 in the green category and the remaining 9 in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted in the treatment programme.
