

Within the period of 12 – 18 August, a total of 7,398 movements were recorded, of which include 821 arrivals and 6,577 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Gwoza, Kala/Balge, Mafa, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state, and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa Michika, Mubi North, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa state. Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Gubio, Gwoza, Kala/Balge and Maiduguri LGAs of Borno state, locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, song and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa state and locations in Bursari, Damaturu and Geidam LGAs of Yobe state.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: flood (76%), poor living conditions (7%), Voluntary relocation (7%), conflict/attack (7%), improved security (3%), military operations (0.3%) and involuntary relocation (0.1%).

Number of individuals by movement triggers





Summary of major movements

Geidam: 2,802 departures were recorded in Geidam LGA of Yobe state. These include 858 departures from Asheikri ward, 644 from Gumsa ward, 494 from Kawuri ward, 364 from Hausari ward, 325 from Ma'anna/Dagambi ward and 117 from Balle Ward. All the departures were due to flood.

Bursari: 1,413 departures were recorded in Bursari LGA of Yobe state. These include 998 departures from Dapchi ward and 415 from Guba ward. All the departures were due to flood.

Damaturu: 1,087 departures were recorded in Damaturu LGA of Yobe state. These include 662 departures from Maisandari/Waziri Ibrahim Estate ward, 425 departures from Kukareta/Warsala ward. All the departures were due to flood.

Gubio: 490 departures were recorded in Gubio LGA of Borno state. These include 265 departures from Gubio I ward comprising of 137 departures to Bolori II ward, 36 to Fezzan ward, 13 to Lamisula Jambamri ward, 2 to Bolori I ward of Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, 13 to Bale Galtimari ward and 34 to Dusuman ward of Jere LGA, other departures within this ward include 4 to Bauchi state, 9 to Yobe and 17 to Kano state. 225 departures from Gubio II ward which include 16 to Bolori I ward, 4 to Bolori II ward, 11 to Gwange ward, 37 to Shehuri North and 49 to Maisandari ward of Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, 28 to Mashamari ward and 16 to Gomari ward of Jere LGA, 3 to Monguno ward of Mungono LGA of Borno state. Other departures within this ward include 43 to Yobe state and 18 to Bauchi state. All the departures were due to the ongoing conflict.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 78 children of 6-59 months. Of the 78 children screened, the MUAC reading was: 4 children (1 from inaccessible and 3 from accessible area) were in the Red category, 15 were in the Yellow category and 59 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 5 LGAs.

The results also include 20 children from neighbouring Cameroon, Chad and Republic of Niger (7 moved to Bama, 10 to Mobbar while 3 moved to Ngala). Out of the 20 children measured, none was in the red category, 14 were in the green category and 6 children were in the yellow category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.

Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
