SUMMARY OF EVENT

Following communal conflicts (misunderstanding on the limits of cantonal borders, that led to a clash between Dadjo and Mouré communities) between 9 and 12 August 2019, during which the village of Harata, located in the département of Kimiti (Sous-préfecture of Kerfi) was burned down, 400 individuals took refuge in the villages of Djorlo and Agoundi (both located in the same sous-préfecture).


