


New Arrival Screening by Nutrition Partners




From the period 9 – 15 September 2019, a total of 1,953 movements were recorded, they composed of 1,583 arrivals and 370 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Hawul, Jere, Konduga, Maiduguri, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno State, and locations in Demsa, Girei, Hong, Maiha, Madagali, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State. Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno State, locations in Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (30%), voluntary relocation (28%), conflict/attack (25%), improved security (8%), fear of attack (7%), military operations (2%) and involuntary relocation (1%).



Number of individuals by movement triggers

Summary of major movements

Jere: 397 arrivals were recorded in Jere LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 383 from Gaji Ganna I ward of Magumeri LGA, 14 from Auno/Chabbol ward of Konduga LGA. 96% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict while 4% were reportedly due to military operations.

Askira/Uba: 115 arrivals and 99 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 7 from Lassa ward, 108 from Rumirgo into Uba and Gunadan within Chul/Rumirgo ward of Askira/Uba LGA. The departures include 62 from Bita/Izge ward of Gwoza LGA of Borno State, 24 from Hong and 13 from Mubi South LGAs of Adamawa State. 76% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to fear of attack while 24% were reportedly due to improved security. 63% of the departures were due to improved security, 24% were due to fear of attack while 13% departed due to poor living conditions.

Monguno: 187 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 119 from Doro/Duguri ward, 50 from Baga ward and 18 from Kukawa ward of Kukawa LGA of Borno State. All the arrivals were due to poor living conditions.

Ngala: 153 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 82 from Rann "A" ward of Kala/Balge LGA. Other arrivals include 49 from Fotokol in Cameroon and 22 from Bol in Chad. 86% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions while 14% were reportedly due to the ongoing conflict.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 131 children of 6-59 months. Of the 131 children screened, the MUAC reading found 3 children (1 from an inaccessible area and 2 from accessible areas) in the Red category, 16 in the Yellow category and 112 in the Green category. No cases of Oedema were reported in the 5 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 39 children from neighbouring Cameroon, Chad and Republic of Niger (10 children moved to Bama, 8 to Mobbar and 21 moved to Ngala); out of the 39 children measured, 2 were in the red category, 31 in the green category and 6 were in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.
