



From the period 16 – 22 September 2019, a total of 1,963 movements were recorded, they composed of 1,587 arrivals and 376 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Jere, Konduga, Maiduguri, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno State, and locations in Demsa, Furore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Mayo-Belwa, Michika, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State. Departures were recorded in Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, Bama and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno State, locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.



ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: conflict/attack (34%), voluntary relocation (23%), poor living conditions (20%), improved security (13%), fear of attack (5%), military operations (4%) and involuntary relocation (2%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Jere: 350 arrivals were recorded in Jere LGA of Borno State. The 350 arrivals were from Gaji Ganna I ward of Magumeri LGA. All the arrivals were due to the ongoing conflict.

Maiduguri: 182 arrivals and 3 departures were recorded in Maiduguri Metropolitan Council of Borno State. The arrivals include 126 from Gajiram ward of Nganzai LGA, 51 from Gudumbali West ward of Guzamala LGA and 5 from Gubio I ward of Gubio LGA. The 3 departures were from Maisandari ward. All the arrivals were due to the ongoing conflict. The departures were all voluntary.

Bama: 108 arrivals and 33 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 63 from Buduwa/Bula Chirabe ward, 13 from Lawanti/Malam/Mastari/Abbaram ward, and 7 from Darajamal ward. Other arrivals include 20 from Kolofata and 3 from Mokolo of Cameroon and 2 from Dikwa Central ward of Dikwa LGA. The 33 departures were from Shehuri/Hausari/Mairi ward. 86% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to military operations, 21% relocated voluntarily while 14% were reportedly due to poor living conditions. The departures were involuntary.

Numan: 116 arrivals and 9 departures were recorded in Numan LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals include 31 from Gamadio ward. 52 from Dong ward and 33 from Borrong ward of Demsa LGA. The 9 departures were from Numan II ward. 55% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated voluntarily while 45% were reportedly due to fear of attack. All the departures were due to poor living conditions.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 131 children of 6-59 months. Of the 131 children screened, the MUAC reading was 4 children (4 from accessible area) in the Red category, 13 in the Yellow category and 114 measured in the Green category. No cases of Oedema were reported in the 6 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 8 children from neighbouring Cameroon and Republic of Niger (1 child moved to Bama, and 7 moved to Mobbar); out of the 8 children measured, none were in the red category, 5 were in the green category and 3 children were in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.
