

The purpose of the Emergency Tracking Tool is to gather information on large and sudden movements of populations. The information is collected through interviews with key informants or direct observations. This report presents information on movements that took place on 2 October 2019 in the town of Faya. These movements were observed at DTM Flow Monitoring Points (FMP) set up in Faya.

SUMMARY OF EVENT

Following the collapse of the Kouri 21 gold mine, 74 individuals left the area to go to Libya. During their movement, they were intercepted by authorities, who took them back to Faya (Borkou Province). These individuals were mainly Chadians (67) and to a lesser extent Sudanese (7).

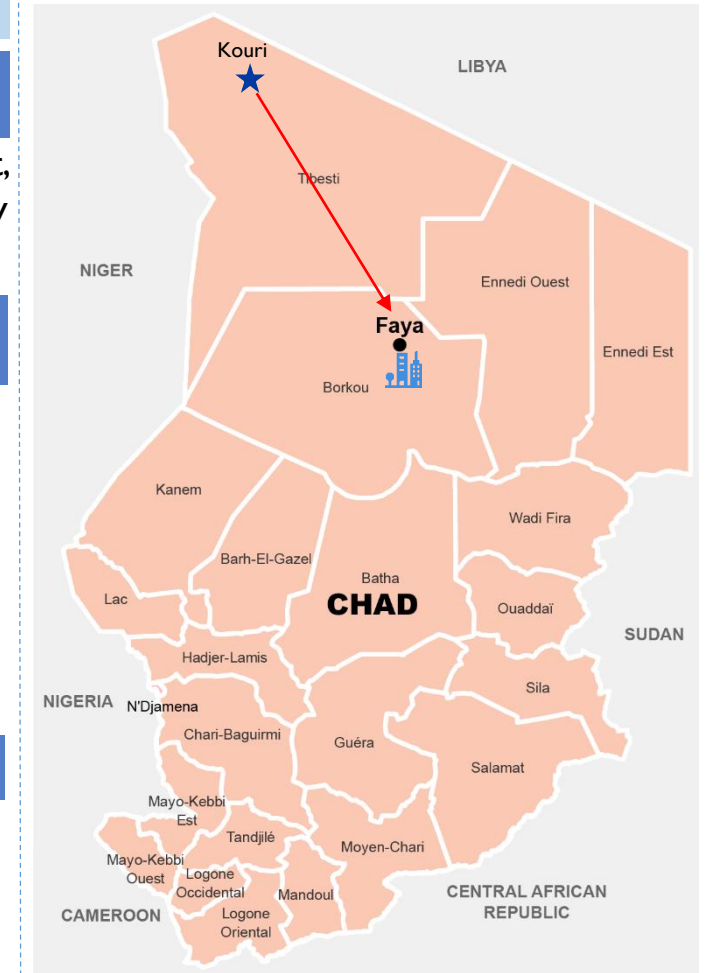
