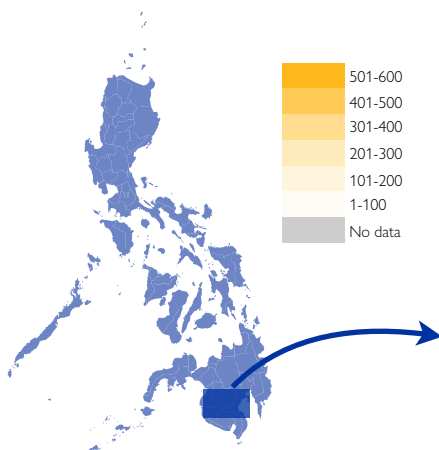

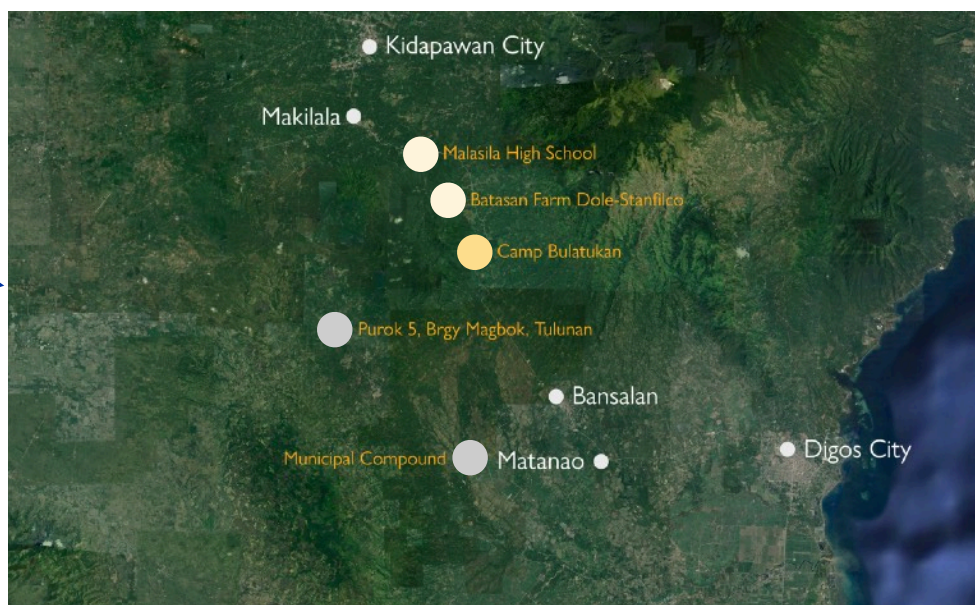
Two major earthquakes hit North Cotabato over the last several days, with two major earthquakes on 29 and 31 October 2019, at 6.3 and 6.6 magnitudes, respectively. The National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council reports that aftershocks are expected over the coming days and weeks. Intensity VII was felt in Tulunan, M'lang and Makilala in Cotabato; Magsaysay and Digos City in Davao del Sur; and Kidapawan City.

As of the latest Department of Social Welfare and Development DROMIC report, 5,497 families or 27,485 persons are displaced. There are 4,127 families or 20,635 persons taking shelter in 27 evacuation centers.

Damage to houses is widely reported, with a total of 27,309 houses, with 20,912 totally damaged and 6,397 partially damaged.



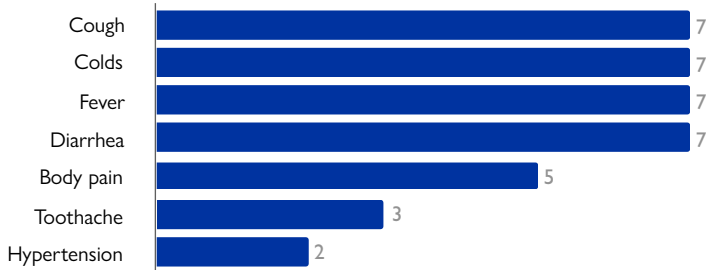

METHODOLOGY

This DTM report refers to the assessment conducted for the displaced families in North Cotabato. Initial data was collected through key informant interviews and focus group discussions on 1 November 2019 in the municipalities affected. IOM deployed a 5-member assessment team to roll out the DTM. Coordination was done with the local government of North Cotabato.

SITES WITH REPORTS OF HEALTH PROBLEMS



An IOM assessment team has been deployed to the affected municipalities. It was found that some remote barangays are still inaccessible due to blocked roads from landslides.

The most urgent needs are water, food and shelter, along with sanitation. They will eventually need non-food items and more sustainable water systems. Health needs will also need to be addressed and can be provided through mobile clinics, as hospitals are inaccessible until they have been assessed and ensured secure.

CCCM

IDPs are scattered and propping up makeshift tents where little open space or empty lots are available, including along roads. This complicates IDP registration and subsequent delivery of humanitarian assistance.

In evacuation sites assessed, no proper registration has taken place yet. No camp managers have yet to be assigned to these camps as well, with barangay officials overseeing the camp in the meantime.

In these sites, there are 2 pregnant women and 5 persons with disability.

Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

Most water comes from deliveries to the sites, with some sites reporting that a shallow well and rivers are also being sourced.

Out of the 8 sites assessed, there is a total of 6 toilets only for the total 1,688 IDPs. One site reported no toilets and the use of open space or toilets from neighboring houses or the river.

IDPs are in need of hygiene kits, specifically soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, sanitary napkins and underwear for both men and women.

Food and Nutrition

Most sites assessed report that food distribution has been regular (daily), although no supplemental feeding has been provided for children, and lactating and pregnant women.

Health

Sites report cases of colds, cough, fever, diarrhea, body pain, toothache and hypertension.

Education

No formal or informal education activities have been done in the sites assessed, largely due to the suspension of classes in the

areas. One site reported that their school has been totally damaged.

Protection

Psychosocial support, particularly stress debriefing, is critical, with local government requesting for support from specialists in neighboring areas. People refuse to enter buildings due to trauma, with some setting up tents outside their homes even when no damage exists.

Security is being provided in the sites through the Barangay Peacekeeping Action Teams.

Only one site reported that there is lighting—but inadequate. The other sites report that no lighting is available, with most of them due to power outages.

Many places of origin are now declared danger zones, with hundreds of families no longer allowed to return to their homes even if their homes have not sustained any damage. They are also unsure for how long their displacement will be.
