

IOM's biometric registration system has been active since 2014, with 904,240 beneficiaries active in its database to date, out of which 56 per cent (506,736 individuals) are women; and 61 per cent (551,934 individuals) are under 18 years old. Since August 2018, IOM and the World Food Programme (WFP) are collaborating on the project "Enhancing targeted food distribution through biometric data management" seeking to contribute to increased food security throughout South Sudan. Under this collaboration, IOM is responsible for checking the eligibility of households receiving assistance through fingerprint authentication at selected distribution sites. Those beneficiaries whose households do not retrieve their food assistance in three consecutive distributions are assumed to no longer be present in the location and subsequently become deactivated. As a result, fluctuations in registered beneficiary numbers can be observed on an ongoing basis. **Biometric registration, complemented through regular authentication, enhances beneficiary targeting, avoiding duplications through fingerprint scanning and ensuring that the assistance reaches the intended beneficiaries.**

Biometric maintenance work is supported by a variety of donors, including DFID, ECHO, SDC and USAID alongside funds received from WFP.

## DEFINITIONS

<b>Active in DTM BMR database</b>	Number of individuals registered and verified in the BMR database
<b>Authenticated</b>	Number of beneficiaries reached through WFP GFD authentication
<b>Newly Registered</b>	Number of individuals who were newly registered, i.e. new entries into the system
<b>Deactivation</b>	Number of beneficiaries who missed 3 consecutive food distributions and have been deactivated from the database system
<b>Change of Checkpoint</b>	Number of individuals for whom the checkpoint (registration location) was changed, e.g. from Bentiu PoC to Nhialdu
<b>Lost Card Replacement</b>	Number of individuals who were assisted by replacing lost cards
<b>Merging Households</b>	Number of beneficiaries who wish to be joined with another family, i.e. merged into one household with a single beneficiary card
<b>De-Registration</b>	As a result of a relocation/facilitated returns or other movement out of the site.
