SITUATIONER

Three major earthquakes hit North Cotabato on 16, 29 and 31 October 2019, at 6.3, 6.6 and 6.5 magnitudes, respectively. According to the latest DSWD-DROMIC report (Report # 29), 66,811 families or 326,816 persons have been affected and 38,739 houses are damaged (23,321 totally destroyed and 15,461 partially damaged). 21,943 families or 105,591 persons are displaced. 77 DSWD-listed IDP sites host 9,941 families or 45,816 persons and 12,002 families or 59,775 persons are otherwise displaced.

The fourth week since the beginning of the emergency has seen more aftershocks as well as heavy rain. The latter further highlights the necessity of upgrading the deteriorating shelters made from the plastic sheeting initially distributed to minimize the IDPs' exposure to the elements as well as improving site lay-out and planning to design and locate shelters and site facilities with long-term displacement in mind.


METHODOLOGY

This DTM report refers to the third round of site assessments conducted in North Cotabato and Davao del Sur from 18 to 23 November 2019. IOM deployed 3 enumerators included among 3 mobile CCCM support teams to roll out the DTM. Coordination was done with the local government of North Cotabato and Davao del Sur, as well as DSWD Regions XI and XII, and P/M/CDRRMOs. Key informant interviews and focus group discussions in the assessed sites are the main data sources. 29 sites were assessed for this report.




Sites with NO separate male & female toilets




Sites with NO separate male & female bathing areas

GENERAL FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

Camp Coordination and Camp Management

- In Magsaysay and Tulunan, advocacy for government recognition of spontaneous sites and ad interim direct site-management by other CCCM actors.
- In Makilala and Kidapawan, technical assistance (site planning and lay-out, coordination with service providers) for government-designated camp managers
- 12 out of all 45 DTM-assessed sites (Rounds 1-3) are identified for relocation or decongestion. Support LGUs in land negotiation and site planning and lay-out.
- 15 out of all 45 DTM-assessed sites (Rounds 1-3) host ethnic minorities mostly from the B'laan and Bagobo tribes. Ensure participation and representation while respecting indigenous culture and coping mechanisms.

Shelter

Find durable shelter options (short term: shelter-grade tarps; long term: transitional shelters) for displacement of at least 12 months.

Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

- More safe water sources
- Proper latrines and bathing cubicles
- Hygiene promotion

Health

Psychosocial support interventions for adults as well as for children while ground-shaking recurs and uncertainty and anxiety related to prolonged displacement remains.

Livelihood


Uncertainty of return for many IDPs impacts livelihood. Livelihood skills inventories and referral to possible stakeholders are recommended.

- Makilala: 32 sites listed by municipal government (hosting 5,238 families or 18,474 persons) with 12 major sites managed directly by DSWD and 20 sites managed by municipal and barangay personnel
- Kidapawan: 2,029 displaced families or 10,145 IDPs in 9 evacuation centers
- The majority of the combined sites in Makilala and Kidapawan are spontaneous sites in outskirts but these have smaller populations than the major evacuation centers near the municipal/city hubs.
- WASH: lack of potable water sources, latrines, bathing cubicles and hygiene promotion. Referral to WASH actors is recommended.
- Protection: lack of lighting for family use and for WASH and other common site facilities for referral to possible providers
- Shelter: Upgrade to shelter-grade tarps and/or transitional shelters is advised.
- Livelihood: Finally, the uncertainty of return facing many of the IDPs has massive implications on their livelihoods. Most of them rely on agriculture located in their places of habitual residence and/or the most affected areas. Aid will have to include access to viable alternative livelihoods with value-chain support.

TULUNAN NORTH COTABATO


- 938 families or 4,690 persons displaced
- No government-recognized evacuation centers and therefore no CCCM interventions by the authorities. Recognition of these spontaneous sites need to be advocated by CCCM support actors so that no one is left behind.
- DTM enumerators assessed 4 spontaneous sites hosting 892 displaced families or 3,854 IDPs.
- WASH: The few latrines and bathing cubicles available are not enough to cover the needs of the IDPs.
- Shelter: plastic sheets now deteriorated and need replacement if not upgrading to more durable materials. Transitional shelters would be the most viable solution.
- Livelihood: Displaced families here mostly depend on employment in rubber plantations also located in the worst-affected areas not yet cleared by Phivolcs and MGB. Alternative livelihood opportunities will need to be made available.

MAGSAYSAY DAVAO DEL SUR


- CCCM: Highest displacement figures (8,942 families or 43,225 persons). Hosting only 1,587 families or 6,450 persons in 10 DSWD-listed evacuation centers. In addition, 283 families or 1,234 persons are staying in 2 spontaneous DTM-assessed sites. Six IDP sites are located within school properties and subject to relocation. CCCM support staff are providing advice on proper site lay-out and planning to refer emerging WASH issues in relocation sites to service providers.
- Shelter: Makeshift shelters are being used in most sites. Deteriorating plastic sheet need replacement or upgrading.
- WASH: Most latrines reported to be available are in Magsaysay sites. Still, 49 latrines are still too few for 7,056 IDPs. More latrines and other WASH facilities need to be provided by WASH actors.
