

The camp manager assigned is managing both Malabuan Elementary and Senior High School which are near each other. There is also no information board in both sites. Portalets have been provided by DOH. A large tent with no privacy partitions was set up for up to 33 families. The IDPs initiated the construction of a cooking counter for those using firewood, but majority of them still use charcoal for cooking inside the tents.
