




From 20 – 26 January 2020, a total of 3,070 movements were recorded, composed of 2,396 arrivals and 674 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Jere, Konduga, Mobbar and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno State. Arrivals were also recorded in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Dikwa, Gwoza and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno State. Departures were also recorded in Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (36%), voluntary relocation (29%), improved security (13%), conflict/attack (11%) and fear of attack (11%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Ngala: 609 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 609 from Rann “A” ward. The arrivals were all due to poor living conditions.

Konduga: 306 arrivals were recorded in Konduga LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 305 from Auno/Chabbol ward and were tracked in Dalori/Wanori ward and one from Diffa of Republic of Niger. 99.7% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict/attack while 0.3% relocated voluntarily.

Jere: 229 arrivals were recorded in Jere LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 27 from Addamari/Ngudua ward and were tracked in Old Maiduguri ward. Other arrivals include 114 from Monguno ward of Monguno LGA and 88 from Gaji Ganna ward of Magumeri LGA. The arrivals were all due to fear of attack.

Bama: 213 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 15 from Abbaram ward and were tracked in Shehuri/Hausari/Mairi ward. Other arrivals include 159 from Mora of Cameroon and 39 from Dikwa Central ward of Dikwa LGA. 93% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated voluntarily while 7% were reportedly due to poor living conditions.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 228 children of 6-59 months. Of the 228 children screened, the MUAC reading was: 7 children (1 from Inaccessible and 6 from an accessible area) in the Red category, 8 in the Yellow category and 213 measured in the Green category. No cases of Oedema were reported in the 4 LGAs that reports were received from.

The results also include 106 children from neighbouring Cameroon and Republic of Niger. Of these arrivals, 38 children moved to Bama, 2 to Gwoza, 12 to Mobbar and 54 to Ngala); 3 of the 106 arrivals were screened into the red category, 100 into the green category and 3 in the yellow category.

All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.

Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
