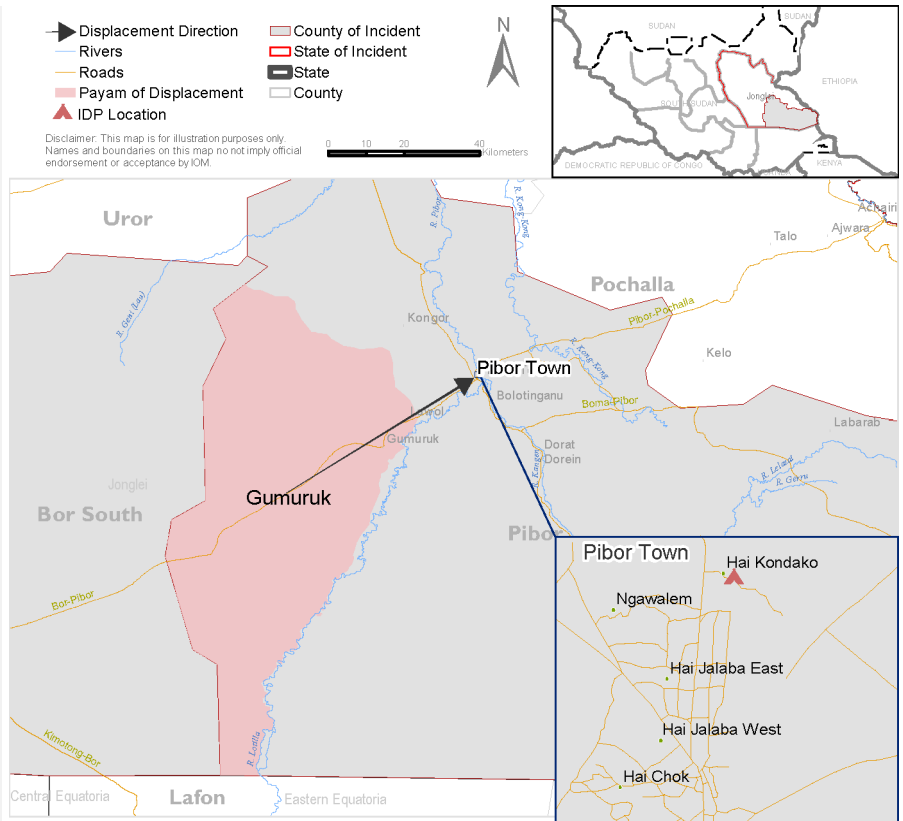


IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) field focal points conducted a rapid assessment in Pibor County following reports of cattle raiding related clashes between the communities of Akobo and Pibor. An estimated 697 individuals (170 households) fled from Gumruk Payam to Kondako.

More than a half of IDPs were male (54%) and under 18 years (51%). According to available information, further clashes occurred in Gumruk and Lekuangle shortly after the assessment. However, these areas were not assessed due to security constraints.

IOM teams access IDP / returnee locations and consult local key informants including community representatives, local authorities or humanitarian partners and triangulate findings to provide partners with the most accurate as possible, actionable and current data.
