Maritime Incidents off the Libyan Coast



As of 14 June 2016, the Libyan Coast Guard (LCG) had rescued **6,865** irregular migrants and reported **153** fatalities for 2016.

Between 1 and 2 June, the LCG in Zuwara retrieved **117** bodies at sea, of which **6** were reportedly children.

On 7 June, LCG intercepted a vessel near Garaboli, east of Tripoli, with **117** migrants onboard, including **3** pregnant women. The nationalities were reported as Guinean, Nigerian, Nigerien, Malian and Ivorian.

Regional Migrant Figures Update

In 2016 (as of 13 June), 210,643 migrants (including refugees) arrived by sea to Europe, whereas 2,859 were reported as dead or missing, of which 343 were reported on 1—13 June. The number of fatalities in 2016 continues to be higher

than the reported period last year (1,838 deaths were recorded along all Mediterranean routes between January and June 2015). The migrants continue making the perilous journey at great risk, travelling under precarious conditions and on ill-equipped boats, leaving them highly vulnerable to both the arduous travel and to the exploitation of organized criminal networks along the way.

IOM Libya Distribution

On 2 June, NFIs and Hygiene Kits were distributed to **361 IDP families** from Sirte in Tarhuna.

On 6 June, NFIs and Hygiene Kits were distributed to **250 IDP**

families at four locations in Al Jufra, southern Libya.

On 13 June, NFIs and Hygiene Kits were distributed to **30 IDP families** from Sirte in the countryside of Zamzam, Abugrain and Abunjaim.

On 14 June, NFIs and Hygiene Kits were distributed to **30 IDP families** from Sirte in Tripoli.

Netherlands and IOM Build Libyan Coast Guard Capacity to Save Lives at Sea



The Netherlands and IOM Libya stranded migrants in Libya to help them to return to their home countries. The most vulnerable migrants will also get reintegration assistance in their home countries.

The EUR 1.5 million project, which will run through October 2017, will provide lifesaving equipment, basic infrastructure and capacity building to the Coast Guard. It will also provide assisted voluntary return to
