

^{*}The site adjacent to Pibor UNMISS is estimated to host approximately 1,553 IDPs as of 29 March 2020. This figure is an estimate based on a calculation multiplying the average household size with the number of shelter in the previous reporting period from which the net outflow was subtracted. Since the shelter count there has been a net outflow of 584 individuals (23-29 March 2020) brining the estimated population size from 2,137 down to 1,553 individuals.

Whilst the site continues to experience a net outflow (732 ind. in the previous week), it should be stressed that new arrivals are continuing to make their way to the site. Some 253 IDPs arrived mainly from the outskirts of Lekuangole Payam (92.5%) with the most common villages of departure being Kongor (51.8%), Monchak (13.4%) and Ngergeny (9.9%). Most of these were reported to be individuals who were rejoining family already present at the site. Those exiting the Pibor UNMISS AA were mostly returning to Lekuangole (87.0%) or Pibor Payam (10.3%) and are generally not expected to return to the site according to key informants.
