27% increase in displacement from the previous week (130 HHs)

IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements 1 in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

During the reporting period, between 03 and 09 April 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 179 (HHs) (approximately 1,074 individuals²) displaced at least once.

Safety and security concerns as a result of the conflict were the main reason for displacement, accounting for 88 per cent (157 HHs) of the total, followed by economic reasons related to conflict, accounting for 12 per cent (22 HHs).

Between 1 January and 9 April 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 5,147 households (HH) (30,882 Individuals) who experienced displacement at least once. Since the beginning of the year, the number of tracked new instances of displacement has been declining steadily.

IOM identified 8 households displaced in the previous reporting period, which covered 27 March - 02 April 2022, in the governorates of Hadramawt (4 HHs) and Marib (4 HHs). These figures have been added to the cumulative displacement total recorded since beginning of the year.3


