IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements¹ in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

During the reporting period, between 10 to 16 April 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 125 households (HHs) (approximately 750 individuals²) displaced at least once.

Safety and security concerns as a result of the conflict were the main reason for displacement, accounting for 84 per cent (105 HHs) of the total, followed by economic reasons related to conflict, accounting for 16 per cent (20 HHs).

Between 1 January and 16 April 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked a cumulative 5,348 households (32,088 individuals) that experienced displacement at least once. Since the beginning of the year, the number of tracked new instances of displacement has been declining steadily.

IOM identified 76 households displaced in the previous reporting period, which covered 3 to 9 April 2022, in the governorates of Al Hodeidah (29 HHs), Al Maharah (21 HHs), Ma'rib (17 HHs), Hadramawt (8 HHs), and Ta'iz (1 HH). These figures have been added to the cumulative displacement total recorded since the beginning of the year.³


1. Displacement in Yemen refers to the 13 governorates where IOM DTM's team has access, namely: Abyan, Ad Dali', Aden, Al Bayda, Al Hodeidah, Al Jawf, Al Maharah, Hadramawt, Lahj, Ma'rib, Shabwah, Socotra, Ta'iz. 2. IOM DTM estimates that one household represents six individuals.
