Displacement the week 10 to 16 Sep 2023 IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated Ta'iz 12 numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual Ma'rib 11 residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements<sup>1</sup> in terms of Al Hodeidah 10 estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks IDP Ad Dali 3 returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence. 
Safety and security concerns as a result of the conflict were the main reason for displacement, accounting for 69 per cent (25 HHs) of the total followed by economic reasons related to conflict, accounting for 31 per cent (11 HHs).

From 1 January to 16 September 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 4,311 households<sup>3</sup> (25,866 Individuals) who experienced displacement at least once.

Displacement in Yemen refers to the 13 governorates where IOM DTM's team has access, namely: Abyan, Ad Dali', Aden, Al Bayda, Al Hodeidah, Al Jawf, Al Maharah, Hadramawt, Lahj, Ma'rib, Shabwah, Socotra, Ta'iz.
