YEMEN IDP DASHBOARD | REPORTING PERIOD: 10 TO 16 DECEMBER 2023



IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements¹ in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks IDP returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

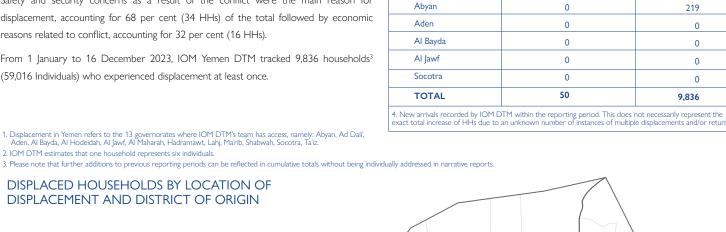
Between 10 and 16 December 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 50 households (HHs) (300 individuals)² who experienced displacement at least once.

Safety and security concerns as a result of the conflict were the main reason for displacement, accounting for 68 per cent (34 HHs) of the total followed by economic reasons related to conflict, accounting for 32 per cent (16 HHs).

From 1 January to 16 December 2023, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 9,836 households³ (59,016 Individuals) who experienced displacement at least once.

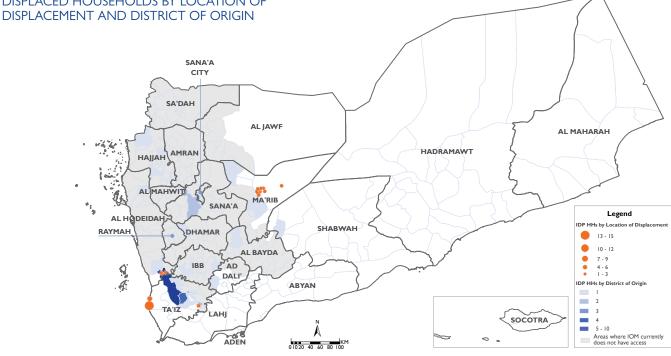

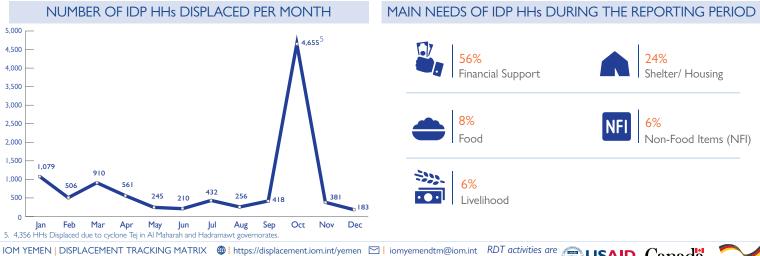
