Following the border closure in Ethiopia IMMEDIATE NEEDS: Water, food, hygiene kits, and due to the stricter border management policies in Yemen, some of the migrants who were transiting through Djibouti on their way to or from the Arabian Peninsula found themselves stranded in the country. These migrants live in spontaneous sites located along the migration corridor. This dashboard presents all the migrants present in the various sites of Djibouti.


The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), through its field enumerator teams and key informants, collects data on a daily basis at migrant sites across the country.

All reported migrants are Ethiopian nationals.

NOTE: This data does not include Djibouti City. Since January 2021, new vulnerable migrants from Yemen and Ethiopia are hosted in the Migration Response Center (MRC) in Obock.

1264 Ethiopian migrants from Yemen





From 1 to 24 April 2021, 1,264 migrants from Yemen (5 female and 1,259 male) arrived at Obock coast. Since May 2020, a total of 12,486 migrants (783 female and 11,703 male) returning from Yemen have been recorded mainly between Moulhoule and Ras Bir.
