

## STRANDED MIGRANTS IN DJIBOUTI AS OF 1 OCTOBER 2020



Following the border closure in Ethiopia and due to the stricter border management policies in Yemen, some of the migrants who were transiting through Djibouti on their way to or from the Arabian Peninsula found themselves stranded in the country. These migrants live in spontaneous sites located along the migration corridor.

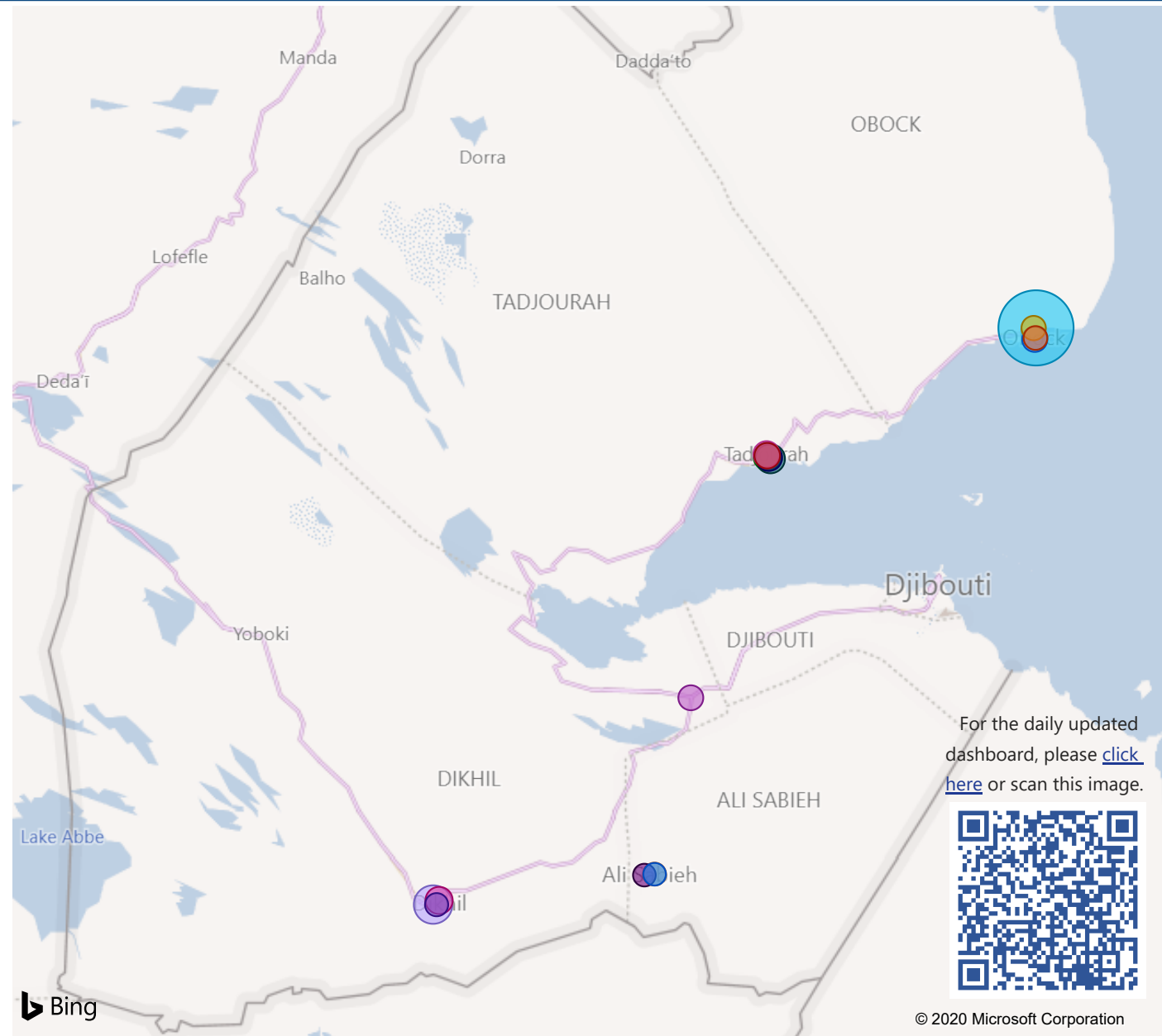
The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), through its field enumerator teams and key informants, collects data on a daily basis at migrant sites across the country.

All reported migrants are Ethiopian nationals.

*NOTE: This data does not include Djibouti City. The estimation of the distribution of migrants by sex is based on the data collected since April 2020.*

## RETURNS FROM YEMEN BETWEEN 25 SEPTEMBER AND 1 OCTOBER 2020



Between 25 September and 1st October, 185 migrants from Yemen (12 female and 173 male) arrived at Obock coast, mainly between Moulhoule and Ras Bir. Since May 2020, a total of 3,145 migrants (580 female and 2,565 male) have returned from Yemen.
