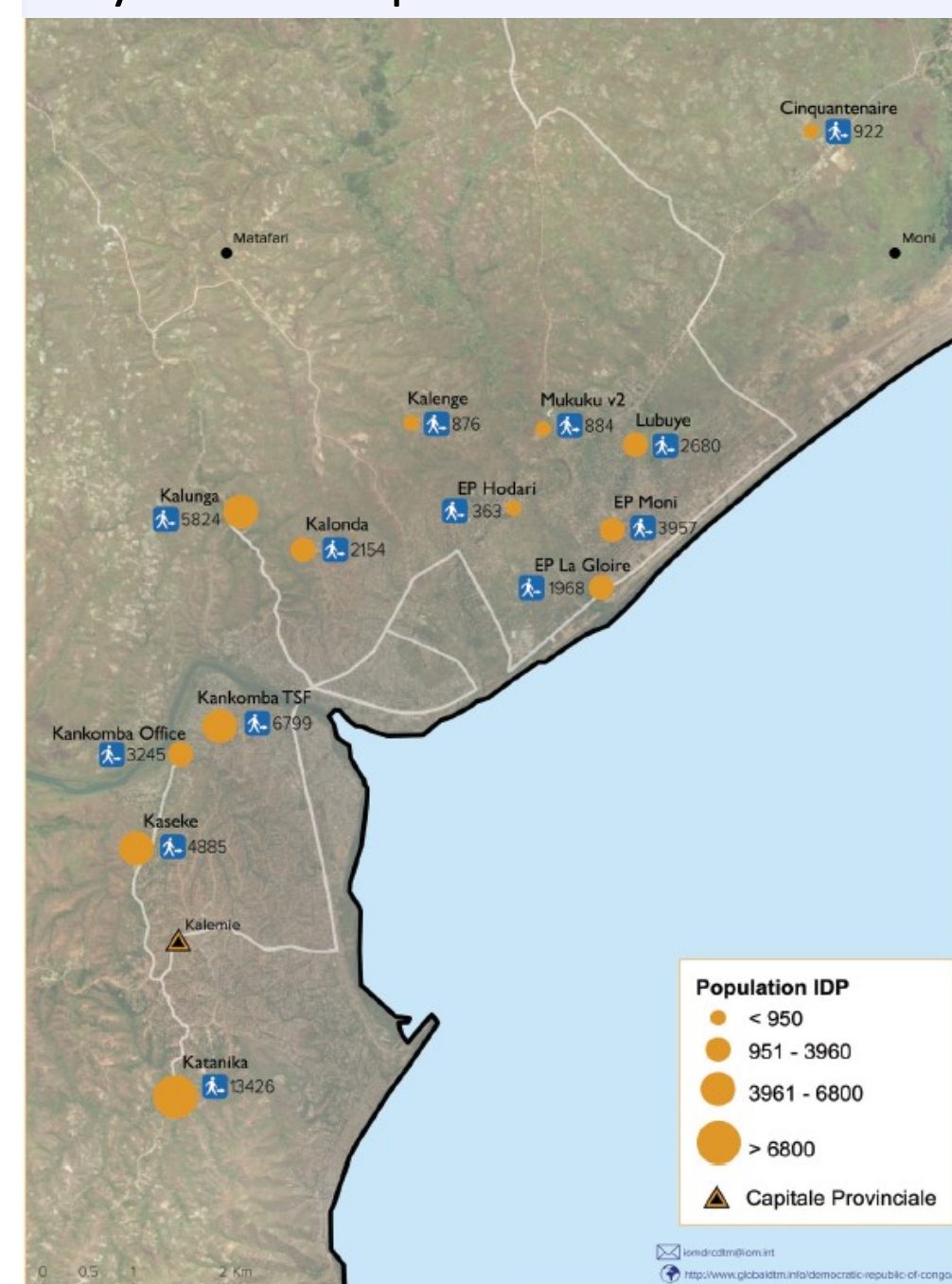


The DTM programme in the Democratic Republic of the Congo collects key information on population movements to inform humanitarian partners and support the delivery of assistance in the regions that are affected by conflict. **Mobility tracking, registration activities and surveys** are conducted in North Kivu, Tanganyika and Kasai.

TANGANYIKA - KALEMIE

The DTM team in Tanganyika is tracking the movement of IDPs and returnees following the inter-ethnic conflict that erupted in the region in 2016. The data below was collected through registration exercises and intention surveys on 1 and 20 October 2017 in seven displacement sites and six collective centres around the capital Kalemie. Since data refer to displacement sites around Kalemie town, they are not representative of the territory of Kalemie as a total.

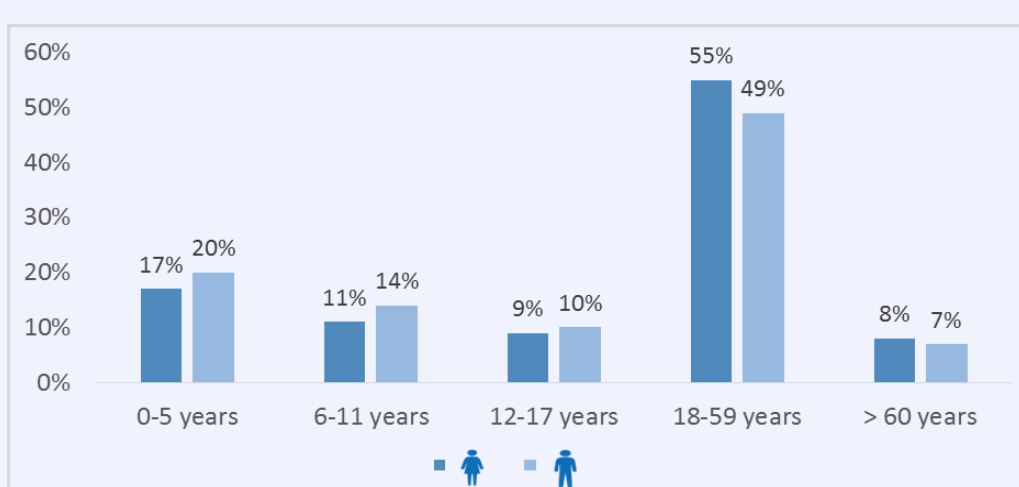


Evaluated displacement sites and collective centers around Kalemie.

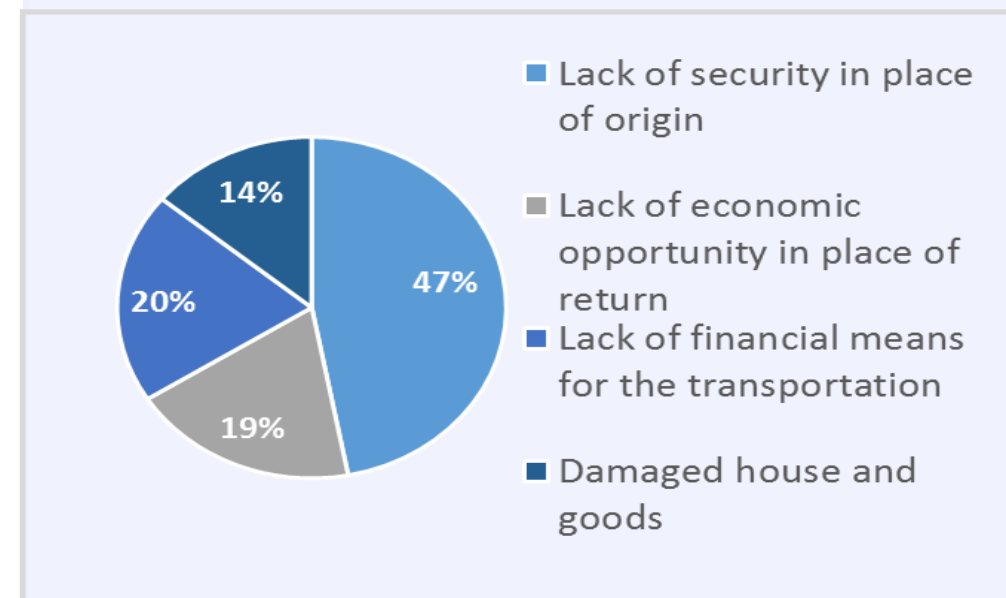

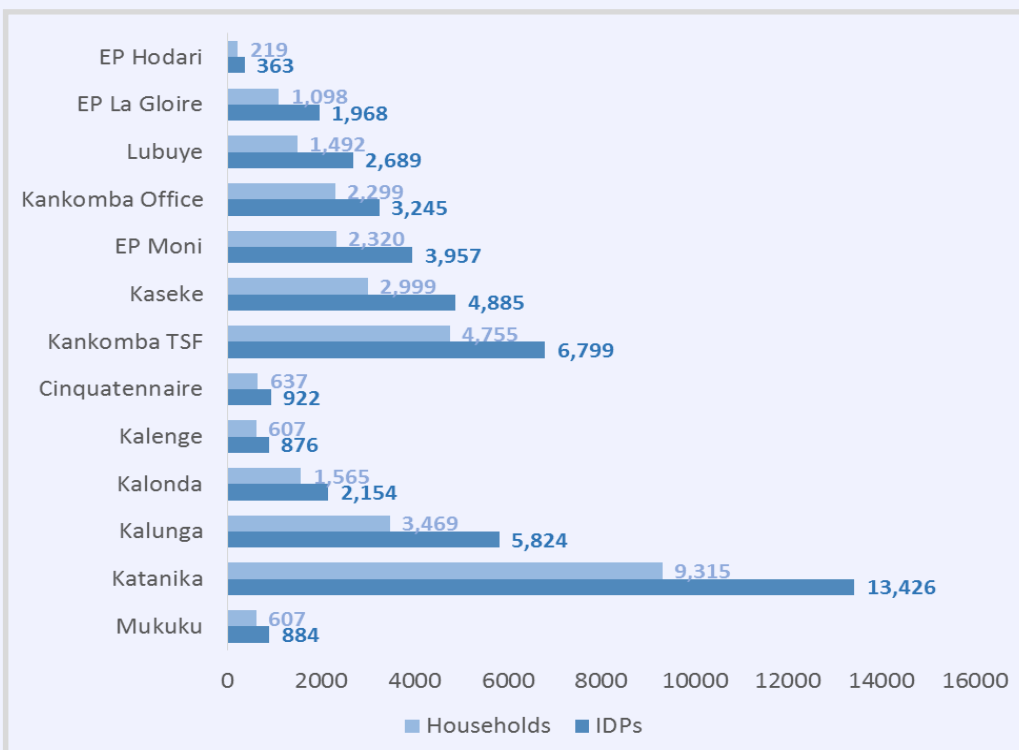

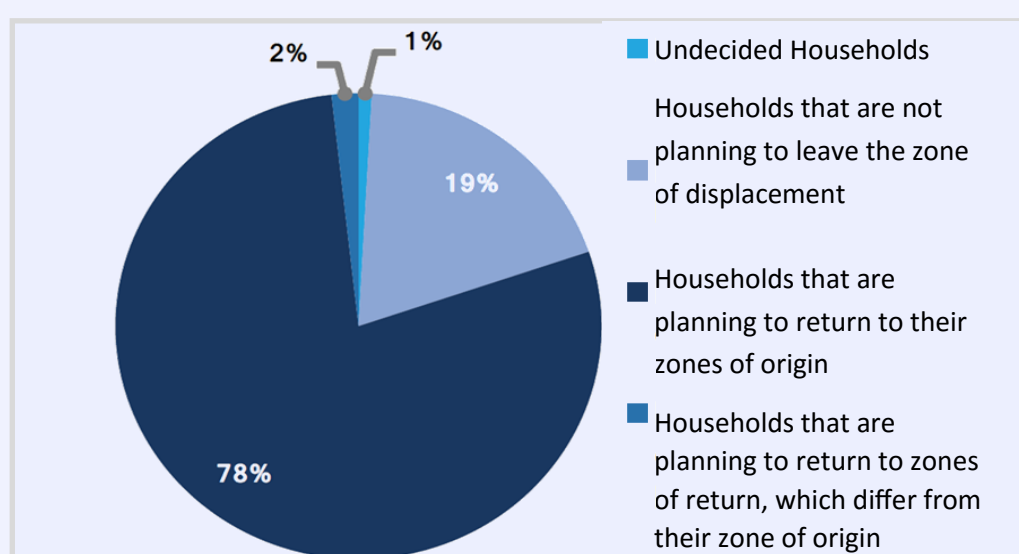
IDPs in the evaluated displacement sites and collective centers in Tanganyika, by sex and age.



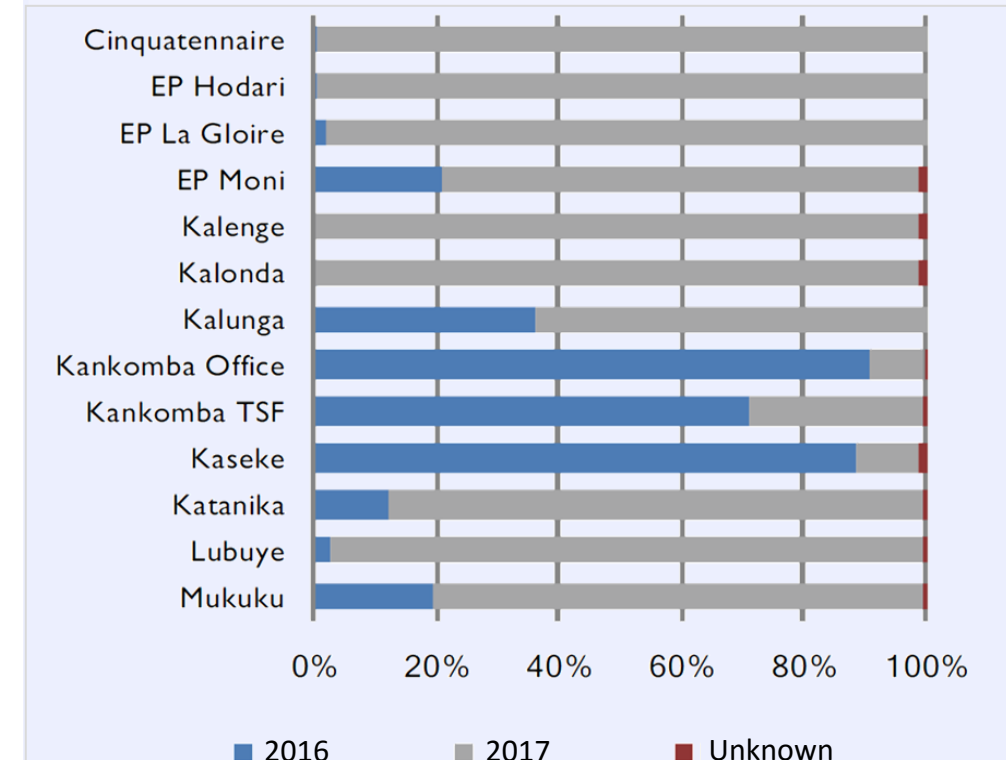
Obstacles to return identified by IDPs who wish to return to their place of origin.

Arrival period of IDPs.

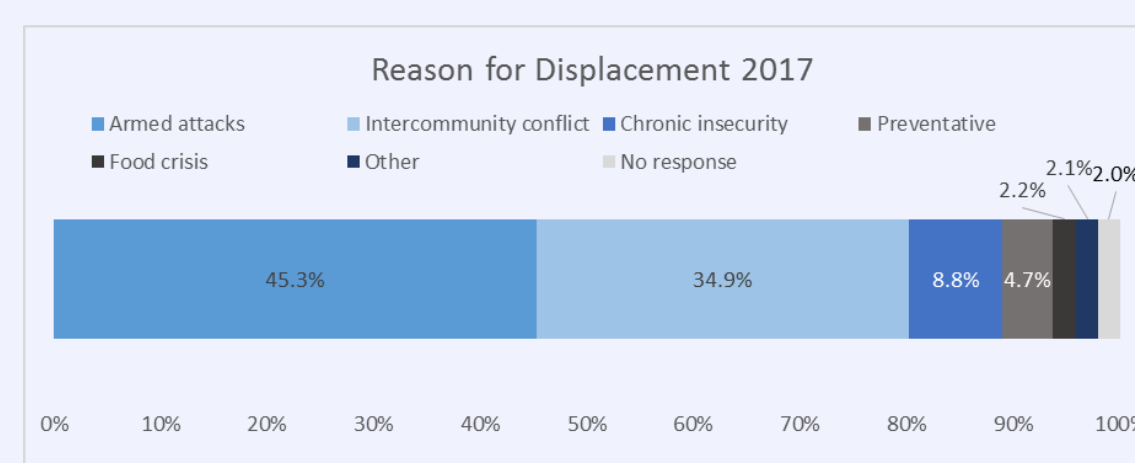
KASAI

The DTM activities started in Kasai in July 2017 following the ethnic and tribal clashes that have caused displacements in the region. The following figures are based on two rounds of assessments in the Kasai Central Province, between 26 August and 16 September (Phase 1) and between 17 and 30 November 2017 (Phase 2), including 3,478 villages and 5,756 persons.

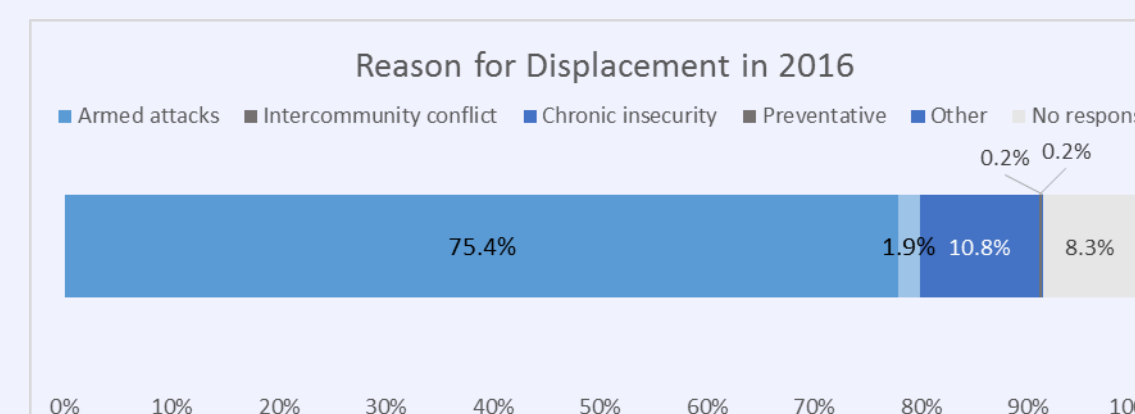

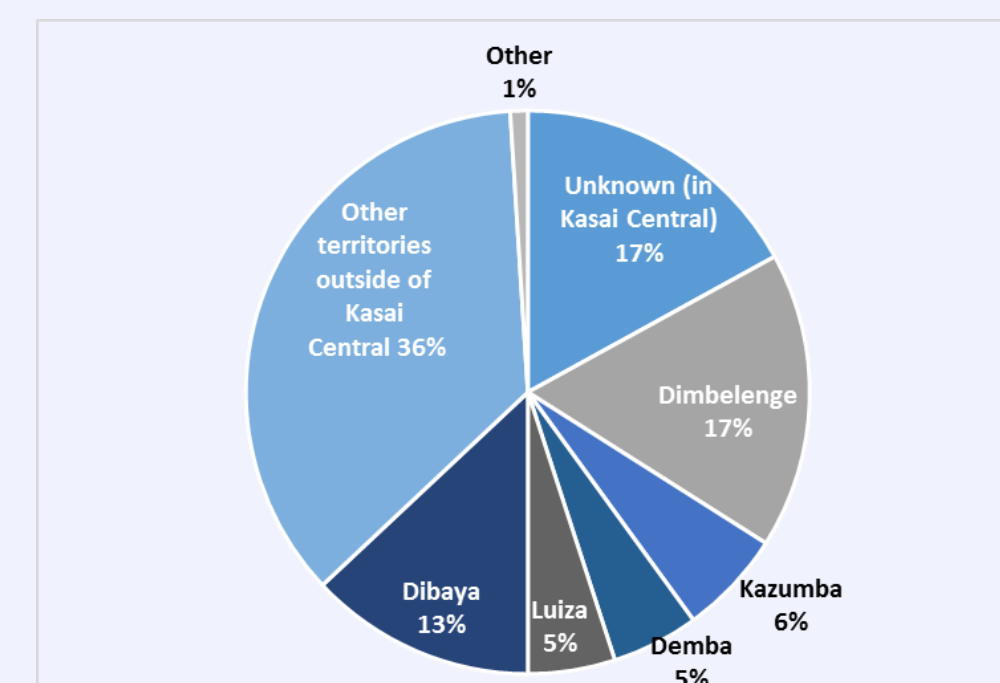

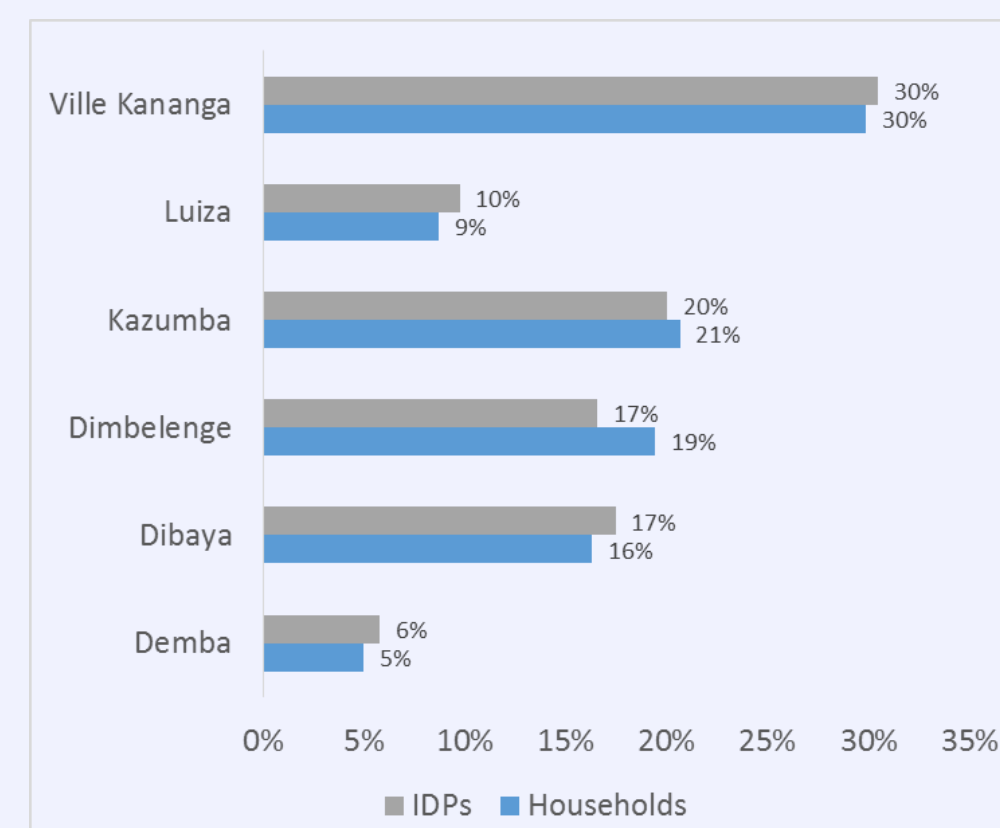
Main reason for displacement, 2017.



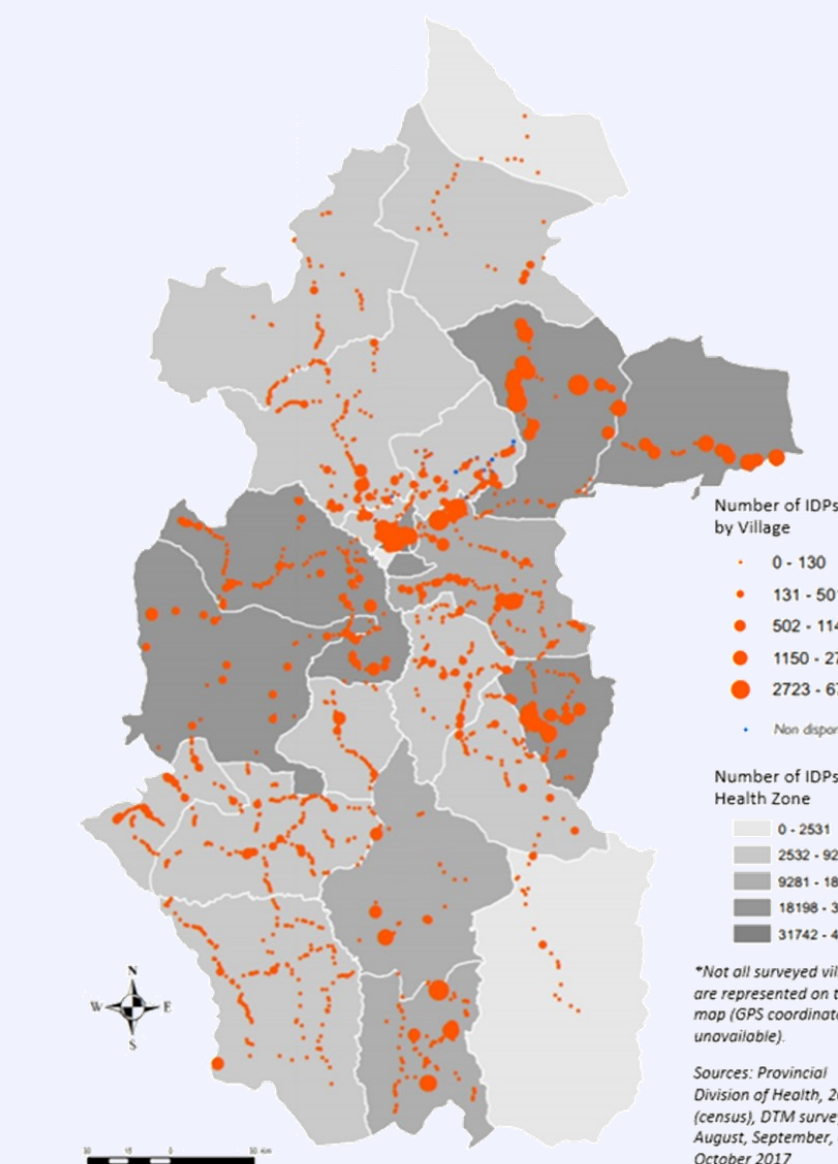
Main reason for displacement, 2016.



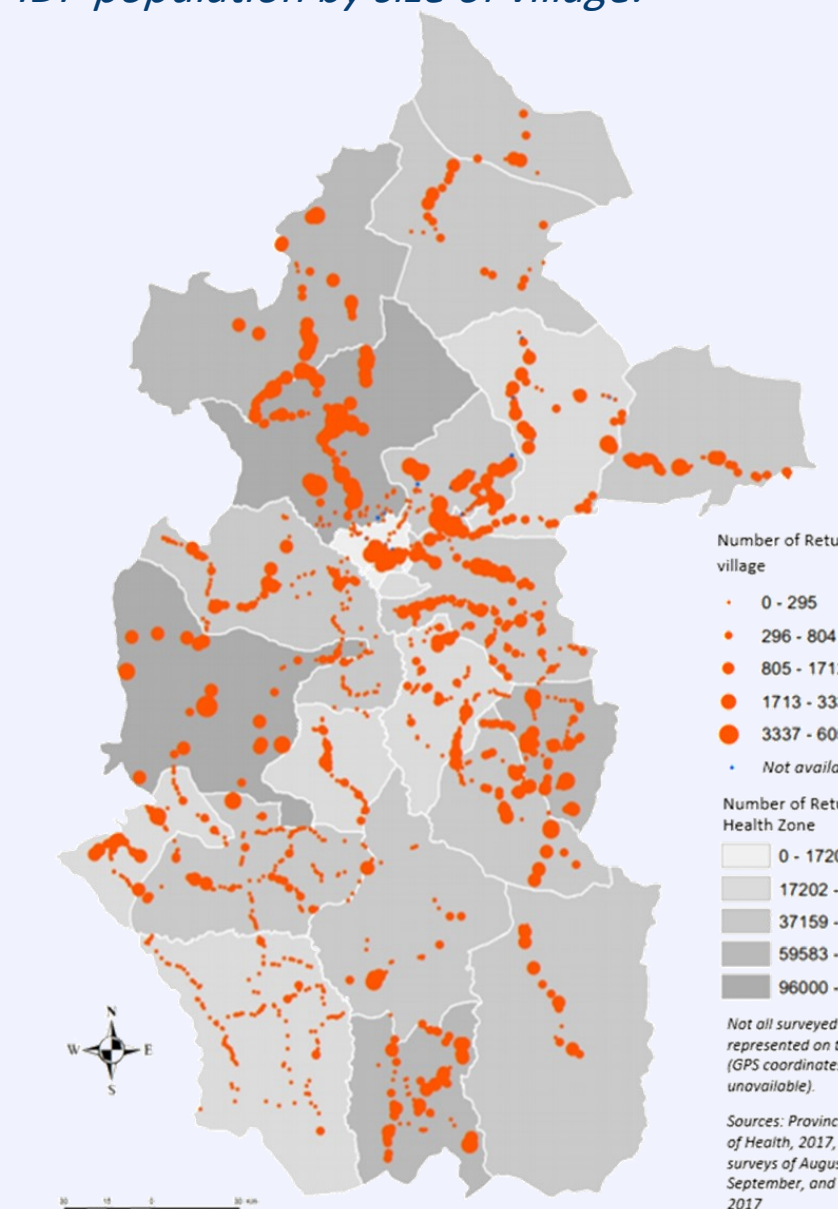
IDPs by territory of origin.

NORTH KIVU

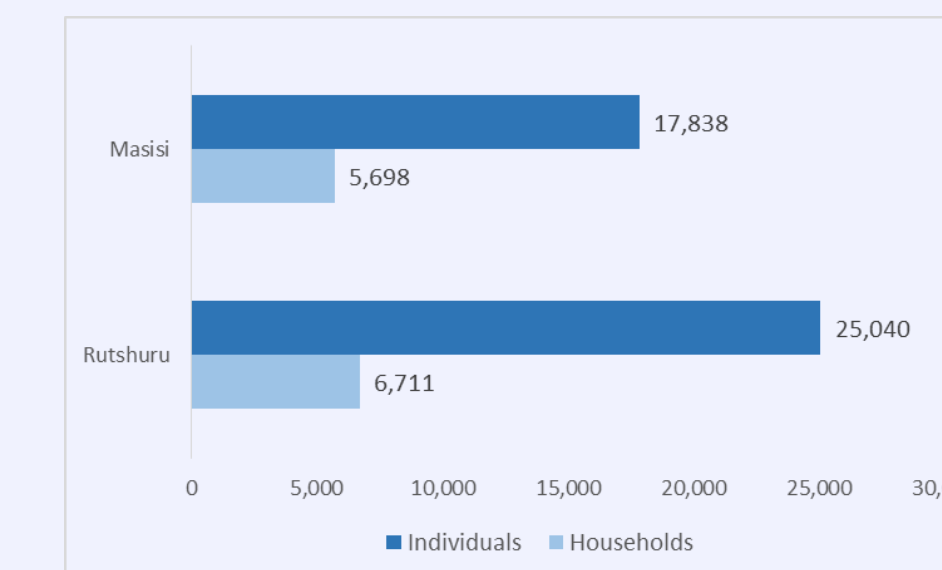
In North Kivu, the DTM team conducts registration activities and intention surveys mainly in the territories of Masisi and Rutshuru. The figures below are based on data collection in 13 displacement sites coordinated between 25 November and 25 December 2017.

The 13 IOM-coordinated displacement sites include 42,878 IDPs (12,409 Households).

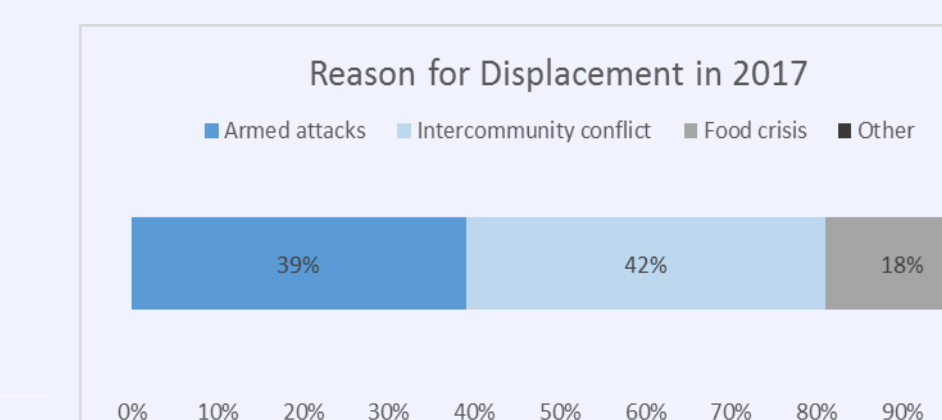


IDPs at CCCM displacement sites in North Kivu, by territory.

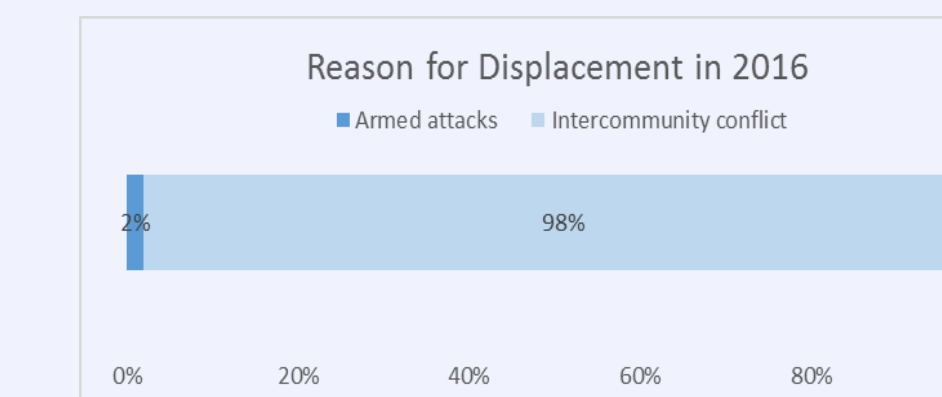
TANGANYIKA - NYUNZU

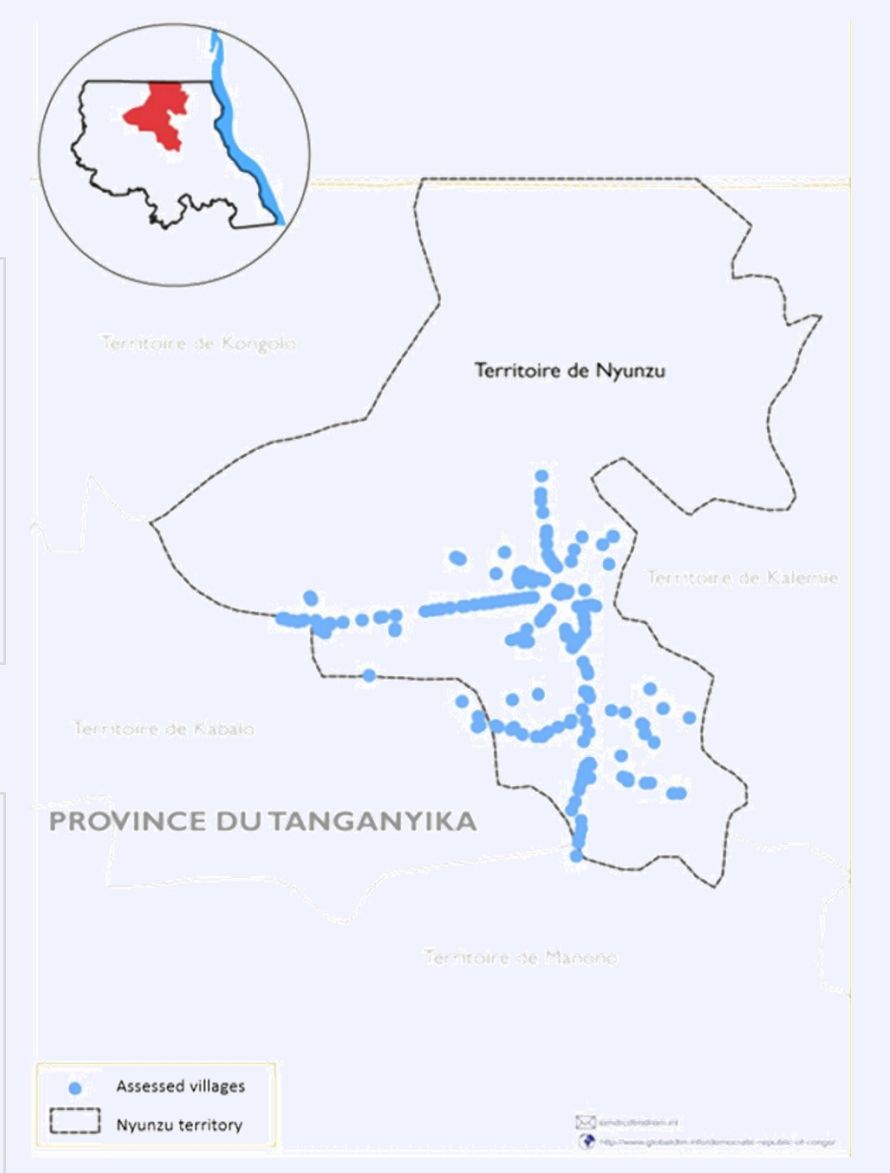

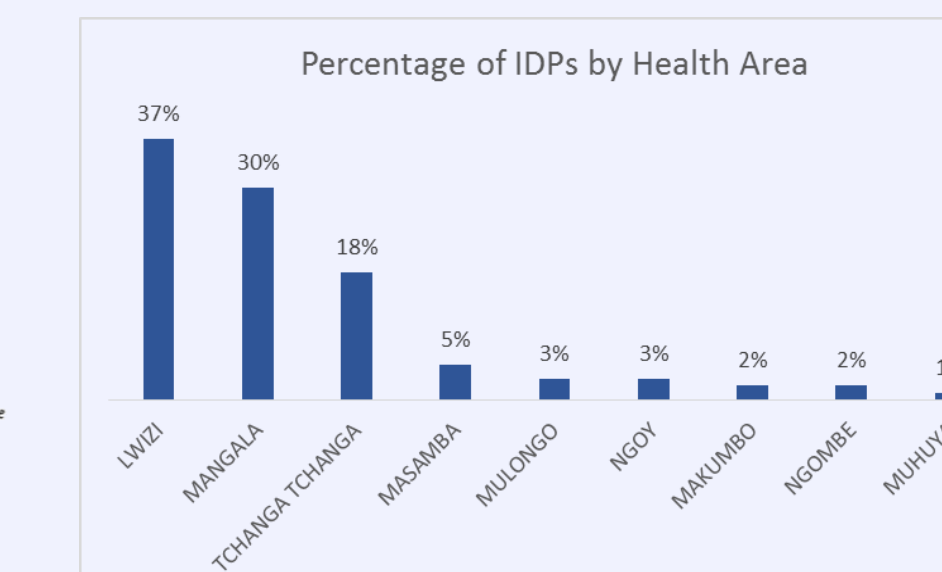
Main reason for displacement, 2017.



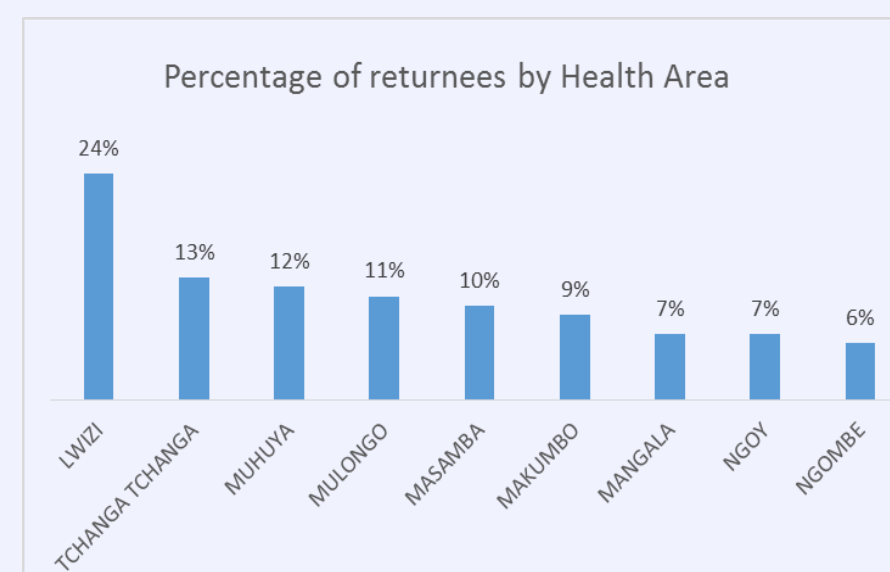
Main reason for displacement, 2016.
