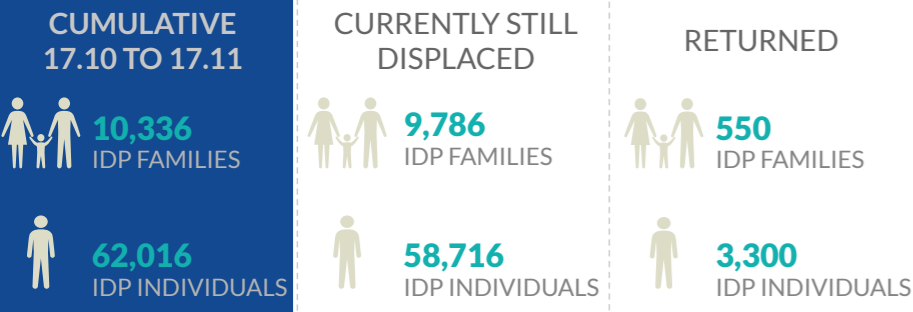
FACTSHEET 3# - MOSUL OPERATIONS FROM 17 OCTOBER TO 17 NOVEMBER

The Emergency Tracking (ET) system is a crisis-based tool that aims at tracking sudden displacement or return movements triggered by specific crises. The ET figures reported on this portal are not cumulative of the all persons affected by the Mosul crisis thus far, rather the

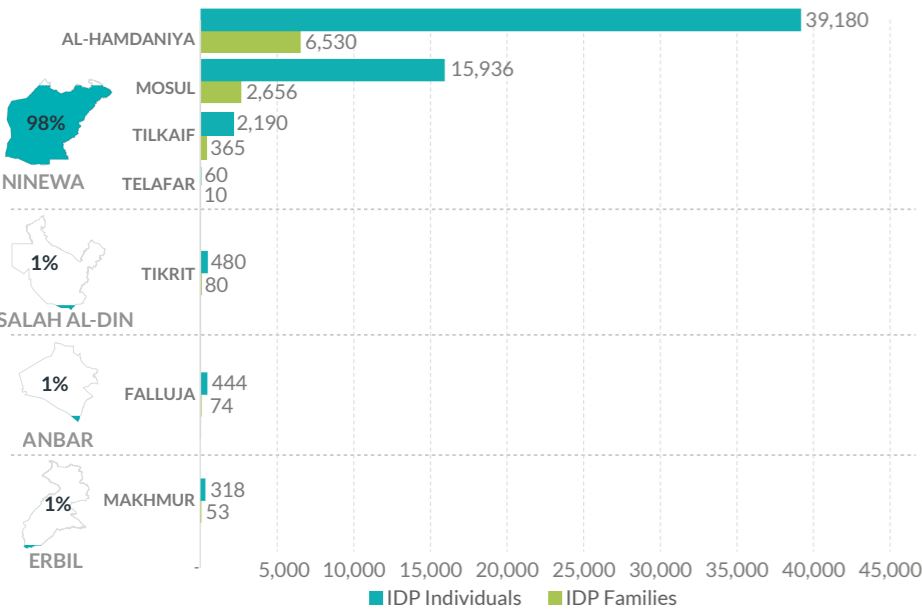

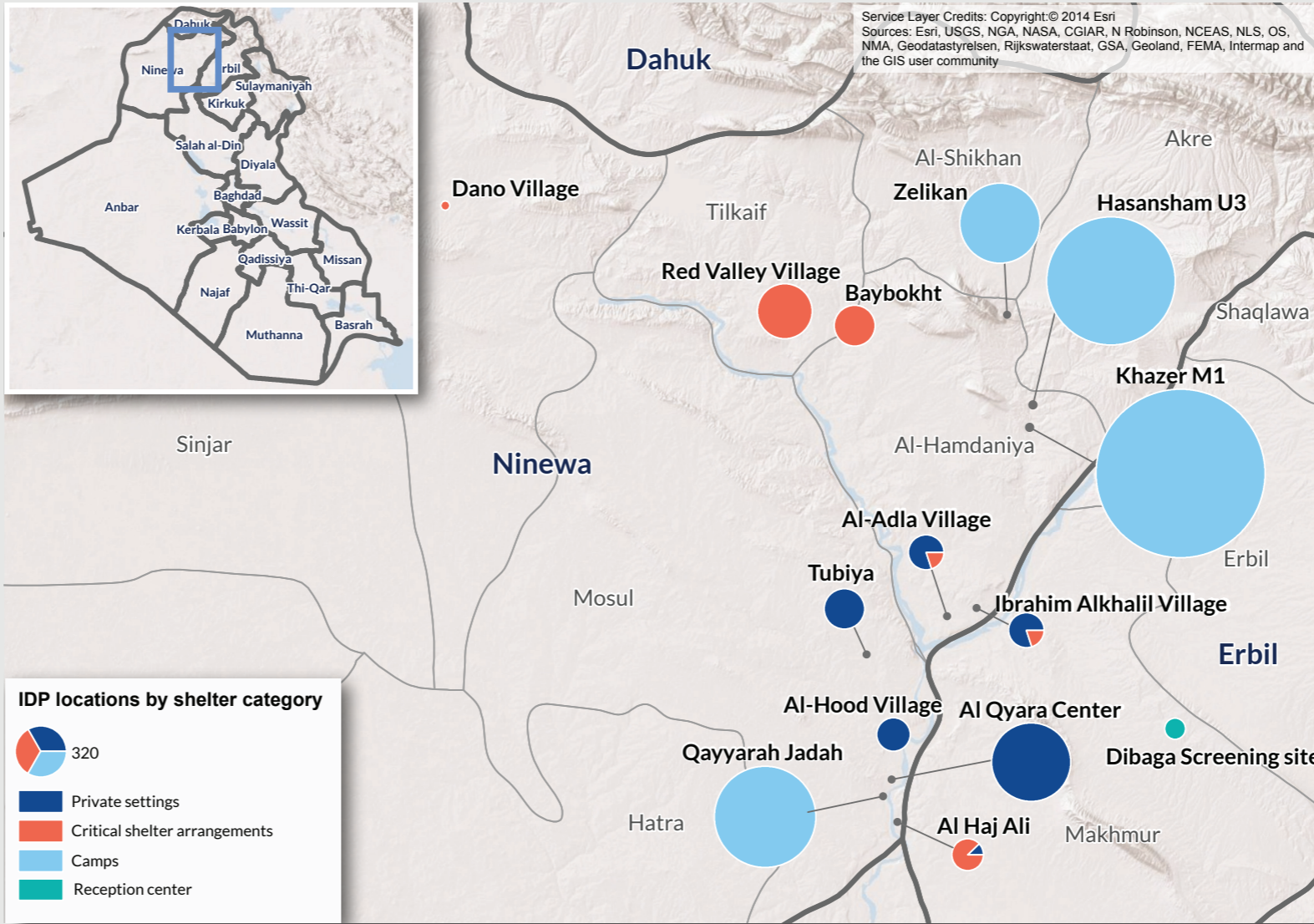
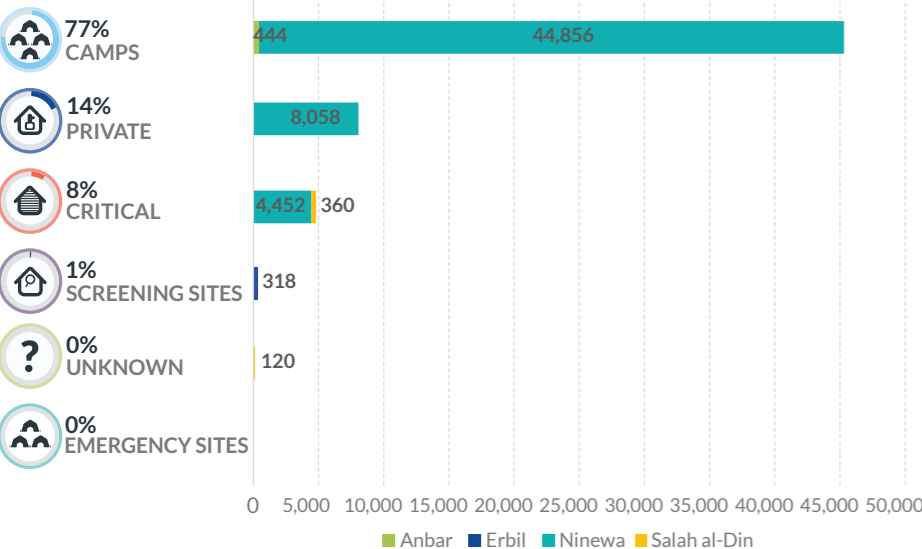

- The IDP population displaced from Nineva governorate as a result of the Mosul military operations grew by 30% during the past week. From the update of 10 November, the IDP population recorded an increase of 2,237 families (13,422 individuals).
- The new displacement movements took place internally within Nineva governorate. Al Hamdaniya district reported an increase of 43% (11,832 individuals), while Mosul had an increase of 11% (1,530 individuals). Telafar district recorded new displacements and is currently hosting 10 families (approximately 60 individuals).
- Nineva governorate is currently hosting 98% of the population displaced after the beginning of the Mosul operations (57,366 individuals).
- In particular, Al Hamdaniya district hosts 67% of the IDP population, with high concentrations in two main camps. Khazer M1 camp (previously called Hasansham M1) currently hosts 35% of the total IDP population, corresponding to 3,450 families (20,700 individuals). Hasansham U3 camp currently hosts 20% of IDPs, that is, 2,000 families (12,000 individuals).
- Of the total IDP population, 8% is in critical shelters, that is, 802 families (4,812 individuals). They are distributed across various locations, particularly in Red Valley Village in Tilkaif district (365 families, 2,190 individuals), Baybokht village (200 families, 1,200 individuals) and Haj Ali in Mosul district (107 families, 642 individuals).
