

Weekly number of stranded migrants at IOM flow monitoring points in Ranong Province, Thailand



Since January 2020, IOM has been monitoring migration flows between Thailand and Myanmar across five different locations in Ranong province, Thailand. This report was produced with secondary data from government sources and primary data collected during observation at each location and counting at Saphan Pla and Hua Thanon.

Stranded migrants are here defined as migrants who want to return to their home country but are unable to do so due to border restrictions and regulations.




When asked about their plans for the future most stranded migrants reported the intention to stay in Ranong Province and wait to cross to Myanmar regularly.

After registering a 39 per cent increase in the number of stranded migrants in week 2 as compared to week 1, this number steadly decreased during week 3 and week 4.

Counted across 5 locations between March 26th and April 22nd.
