
DTM (COVID-19) GLOBAL MOBILITY RESTRICTION OVERVIEW 12 March, 2020




Overview: Since WHO declared COVID-19 a pandemic on 11th March 2020, there was an escalation of COVID-19 related travel measures issued by countries, territories or areas restricting movements of passengers or nationals, and/or an intensification of health dependent travel conditions, with 2059 new measures issued in one day. As of 12th March 2020, there were at least 3,879 known measures implemented due to COVID-19 issued by 106 countries, territories or areas, an increase of 88% from the 1820 restrictions reported yesterday. The United States of America introduced travel restrictions on all Europe entry passengers arriving from or having been in the Schengen, affecting 26 countries (excluding the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Ireland) effective from 13th March 2020 for a period of 30 days. Restriction of movement for non-nationals is now also in place in India, with the suspension of tourist visa and e-visa services until 15th April. This includes travel granted to Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) card holders who are not nationals but from ethnic Indian families living abroad but excludes diplomatic and UN staff. In Europe, three new countries introduced travel restrictions or medical measures, including Croatia which has required that passengers of the People's Republic of China, Germany, Hong Kong SAR, China, Japan, the Republic of Korea, or Singapore self-quarantine for 14 days, Republic of Moldova which has imposed a total travel restriction on passengers from People's Republic of China, Italy, Republic of Korea, the Islamic Republic of Iran and Serbia which has banned passengers arriving from Italy, People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, the Islamic Republic of Iran or Switzerland. There was an increase in travel measures, with 17 new travel restrictions such as suspension of visa on arrival and nationality bans imposed on European countries by non-European countries. Chile has introduced medical measures on passengers and airline crew arriving from Italy and Spain. There continues to be an increase in nationalitybased and passenger travel restrictions introduced from Kazakhstan, St Maarten, Viet Nam and Thailand. Medical measures and health dependent conditions have been made more stringent, reporting a 145% increase from previous day. Thailand introduced a requirement of compulsory medical insurance (100,000 USD) for passengers from the Peoples Republic of China, Hong Kong SAR, China, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Italy, the Republic of Korea or Macao SAR, China. Hong Kong SAR, China has introduced mandatory stay in a quarantine centre for people who have been in France, Germany, Italy, Japan and Spain in the last 14 days (in effect from 14th March 2020). Additionally, changes in previous visa arrangements, including invalidating previously issued visas or imposing pre-departure visa for some nationalities continue to increase, as well as travel requirements tied to proof of health and mandatory health screenings. 
Most Common Imposed Restriction Types in %

Number of Countries/ Territories/ Areas with Restrictions Imposed upon them








Medical Restrictions
