DISCLAIMER

Data presented in this document are representative of the individuals captured at the flow monitoring points during the timeframe indicated. Data should not be generalised and do not represent a full picture of inter and intra-regional migration, but rather of migration flows at the specific locations monitored. For example, while IOM aims to establish flow monitoring points at locations with high transit flows (based on information from informed stakeholders), flows are fluid and specific locations will provide an incomplete picture. The monitoring of flows in an assessed location should not lead to assumptions about flows in a non-assessed location or area without monitoring points.

Migrants adjust their routes according to opportunities and obstacles they encounter along their journey. Their intended transit and destination locations are often subject to change. This renders the systematic assessment of their mobility throughout the region complex.

Flow Monitoring is one of the four components of IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), a system that tracks and monitors displacement and population mobility. Flow Monitoring generally relies on two tools, (i) Flow Monitoring Registry (FMR), which observes migration flows and produces quantitative, observational data based on groups arriving or departing together and (ii) Flow Monitoring Survey (FMS) which produces qualitative data on intentions and profiles of individuals.

Both exercises are conducted at flow monitoring points (FMPs), which are often major transport hubs or key border crossings points of high mobility, identified through extensive consultation with key informants. These key informants are often government officials, local community leaders, and humanitarian partners who have widespread knowledge about population mobility in their respective locations.

Flow Monitoring Survey data was collected once a week from 1 May to 31 July 2021 by trained enumerators and supervised by designated field staff. It is important to note that this methodology allows for regular information on trends along or within a specific network of points that track a particular migratory route. However, the restricted geographic coverage, time constraint and self-reported nature of responses all constitute limitations to the methodology, which does not provide representative data but rather an indication of trends.

The findings in this report are reflective of data collected from 1 May to 31 July 2021. During this period, a total of 62,684 movements were observed through FMR, and 2,694 migrants were approached to answer the FMS. However, of the migrants approached, 7 migrants did not know if they had already participated in the survey, 3 migrants had already participated, 3 migrants did not consent to being interviewed and 1 migrant did not know if they consented, bringing the sample size to 2,680 respondents. Children below the age of 14 years old were not asked to participate in the survey.




Figure 1: Number of migrants surveyed at each flow monitoring point.




Figure 2: Number of migrants surveyed each week from May to July 2021.

Figure 2 shows the number of migrants surveyed each week across the five FMPs throughout the reporting period. Note that changes in the number of surveyed migrants do not necessarily reflect broader migration trends. A high number of surveys were answered during the third week of May and the first week of July. However, there was a decline in the

number of migrants surveyed during the last week of July following the closure of the Galafi flow monitoring point. Note that there is a positive correlation between the number of flows captured through the Flow Monitoring Registry tool and the number of surveys answered through the Flow Monitoring Survey tool.




Figure 3: Final intended destinations of migrants inflowing and outflowing from Ethiopia.






Sex of Migrants




Sex and Age of Migrants




Most Reported Marital Statuses of Migrants











Top 5 Highest Levels of Education of Migrants




The most common level of education reportedly obtained by respondents was primary school (42.1%). A sizeable portion of migrants (22%) have attended lower than secondary school. More than a quarter of respondents (26.8%) reported receiving less than primary education.

An estimated 30.7% of migrants are either employed or self-employed, while roughly 62.7% of migrants are unemployed.


Main Profession/Occupation of Migrants Prior to Departure



Of the 1,265 migrants who revealed their main occupation prior to departure, a majority were skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (492 individuals or 38.9%).



TRAVEL HISTORY




Of the 2,680 migrants who revealed their country of departure, a large majority of them left from Ethiopia (2,014 migrants or 75.1%). As many as 682 migrants (33.9%) intend to travel from Ethiopia to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

The second largest group consists of 275 migrants (10.3%) who originally left Sudan and came to

Ethiopia. Of that figure, 239 migrants (86.9%) indicated that Ethiopia was their intended final destination.

The third most reported country of departure is Kenya with 127 migrants (4.7%). Of that number, 71 migrants (55.9%) cited Ethiopia as their intended final destination.


Top 10 Countries of Intended Final Destination



Reasons for Movement by Route**




Travelling for economic reasons is the main motivator for undertaking journeys across all routes. 21% of migrants on the Eastern route, and 9.2% of migrants on the HoA route travel for economic reasons. 4.2% of migrants on the Eastern route

travelled due to war or conflict. Migrants along the Horn of Africa (HoA) route travelled for a mix of reasons including economic reasons (9%), to rejoin family members or for marriage (7.1%), slow environmental change (2.7%) and war or conflict (1.2%).



INTENTIONS

Reason for Choosing Destination Country**



When asked about the reason behind the choice of destination country, 1,676 migrants (48%) cited job opportunities as the main reason. This is followed by 438 migrants (13%) who mentioned returning home as one reason. Meanwhile, 346 (10%) migrants are following their friends or family along the journey. Appealing socio economic conditions in the destination country were cited by 246 migrants (7%). Another 207 migrants (6%) chose the destination country because their family is there. 138 migrants (4%) cited safety as the reason behind the choice of destination country and 112 migrants (3%) cited creating a business or returning to their business.


Intended Final Destinations of Migrants Who Are Travelling By Specific Reasons









Main Difficulties Faced by Migrants**




