

## Tulus and Gereida, South Darfur UPDATE 1: 5 APRIL 2022

EMERGENCY EVENT TRACKING Data collection: 2 April 2022

The DTM Emergency Event Tracking (EET) is deployed to track sudden displacement and population movements, provide more frequent updates on the scale of displacement, and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the new Mobility Tracking methodology in Sudan (Round Three), and activated on a need basis, EET utilises a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population presence per location – a useful tool for humanitarian response planning and design.

## **Event Overview**






On 29 March 2022, inter-communal clashes between the Rezeigat and Falata tribes took place across Gereida and Tulus localities following an armed robbery in Al Radoum locality, South Darfur on 27 March 2022. Field teams indicate that affected areas include Um Balula village and areas east of Shergeila in Gereida locality, and Sefaya village in Tulus locality. On 30 March 2022, field teams reported that the villages of Sanam Al-naga, Hadoub, and Abu Jabra in Gereida locality were completely burnt down. Additionally, residents of Dika village were displaced to the outskirts of Gereida Town. On 31 March 2022, Dika village was completely burnt down, and residents seeking shelter near Gereida Town were attacked. Field teams indicate that over the following days, approximately 60 households returned to Dika village and have sought refuge in open area settlements. Field teams report that joint security forces were deployed to the area over the weekend to defuse the security

The first EET update estimates a total number of 3,466 IDPs (652 households) currently seeking shelter in the outskirts of Gereida Town (46%) and Dika village (10%) in Gereida locality, as well as Shergeila (Um Jammam) (44%) in Tulus locality, South Darfur. This IDP caseload was originally displaced from Dika village (39%), Hadoub (29%), Abu Jabrah (19%), Tuel (9%), and Dagama (4%) and Gereida locality, South Darfur.

Field teams indicate that 97 individuals have been killed, 87 individuals were injured, and 652 cases of reported lost goods, cattle and/or livestock. All displaced individuals are Sudanese nationals. At least 243 cases of additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support were identified by key informants through DTM's protection indicator. Additionally, DTM Sudan estimates that there are approximately 520 persons with disabilities among the IDP caseload. Based on a ranking scale, the three priority needs across the caseload are Emergency Shelter, Food, and Non-Food Items.






## **Return Intention**

Data collected through the Return Intention indicator suggests that the entire IDP caseload (100%) intends to move to a third location upon improvement of the security situation. Field teams report that locations cited by key informants include Nyala IDP camp in Nyala locality, as well as Tulus Town and Sergaila in Tulus locality, South Darfur.
